



"The operating entity of the financial mechanism is requested:

- (b) To provide support for the [NAP] process, while maintaining support for the [LDC] work programme, including [NAPAs];
- (c) To encourage a flexible approach that enables the [LDC] Parties to access funding for components of the [NAP] process as identified by the [LDC] Parties in response to national needs and circumstances"

Accessing support

GEFSEC proposes that any LDC Party could access LDCF resources in support of the preparation of its NAP process:

- consistent with the objectives and principles
- within the scope defined by the Initial Guidelines:
 - (i) laying the groundwork and addressing gaps
 - (ii) preparatory elements
 - (iii) implementation strategies
 - (iv) monitoring, reporting and review (paras 2–6)
- through existing GEF modalities:
 - medium-sized projects, full-sized projects and programmatic approaches.
