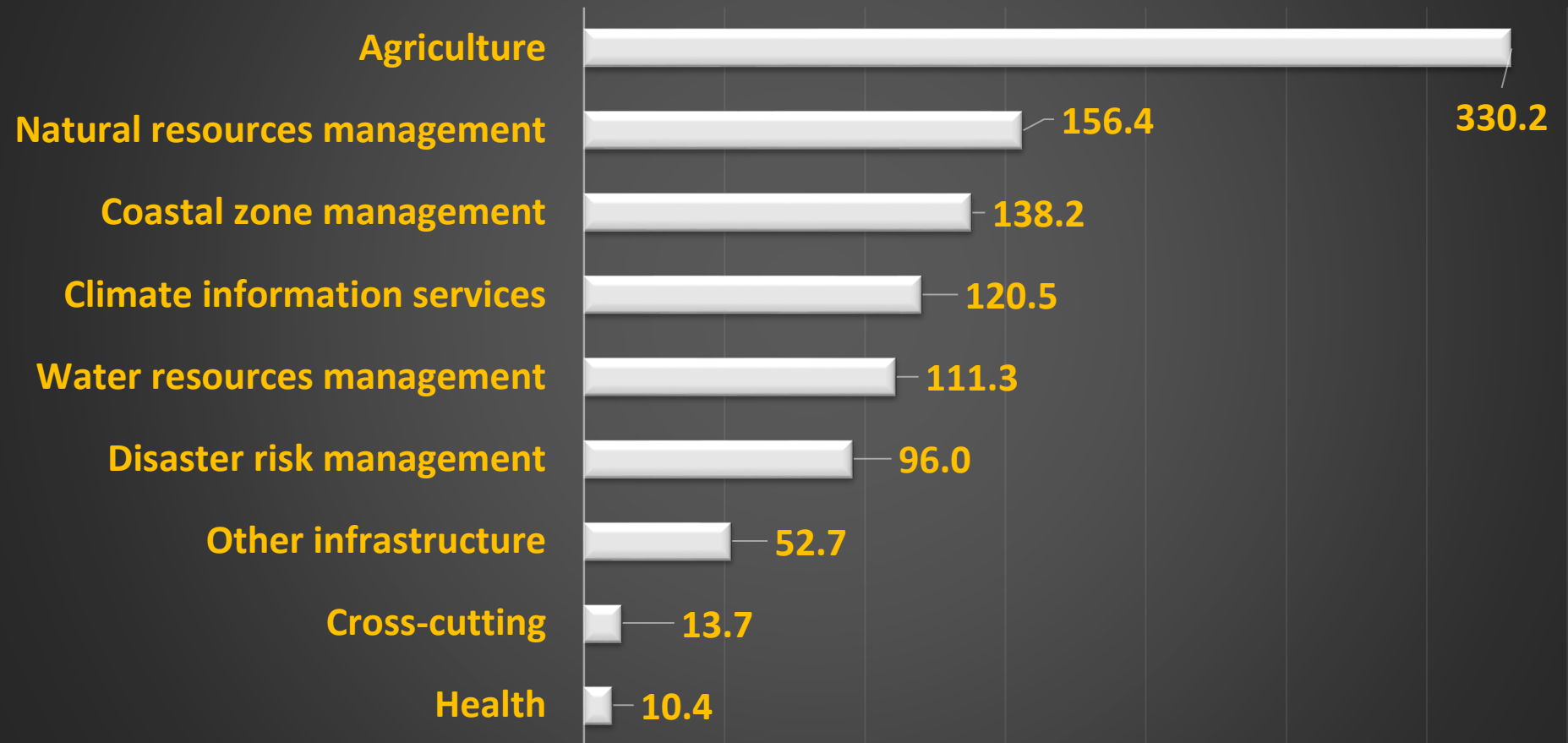

- Projects are consistent with LDCF strategies, eligibility criteria, and priorities;
- NAPA projects are **mainstreaming gender** into adaptation initiatives;
- large majority of NAPA implementation projects included wide stakeholder involvement. **(GEF Independent Evaluation Office, LDCF Program Evaluation 2016)**

# Addressing the remaining elements of the LDC WP

- Building capacity for LDCs to participate effectively in intergovernmental climate change processes (\$4.5M): addresses gaps in existing support to **national climate change secretariats and/or focal points**, and provides **training to develop the capacity of LDC negotiators**
- Support for **public awareness, technology transfer and climate information services** is routinely provided in the context of NAPA implementation; in response to LDC demand
- **...and NAPs (next slide)**

# Recent support towards the NAP process

- Senegal National Adaptation Plan (\$3.3M)
- Building the capacity of Rwanda's government to advance the NAP process (\$6.7M)
- Chad National Adaptation Plan (\$6.5M)
- NAP Global Support Program (\$9M)
- Many projects with NAP elements



# Technical Review of the LDCF

- COP 21 request to GEF Secretariat to carry out technical review
- GEF Secretariat conducted review by:
  - i. consulting informally and formally with relevant stakeholders in least developed countries; and*
  - ii. prepared document (circulated twice for comments) on the technical review*
  - iii. annexed to the GEF's report to COP 22.*
- Guidance to GEF from COP 22 expected to follow up on technical review
