# Experiences

- Use of regional platforms such as ASEAN
- Limited experience on sectoral approaches with exception of examples on river basin management (Mekong)
- Challenges with coordination and sharing of data
- Challenges with duplication of efforts
- Pilot projects exist but upscaling needs to be done
- Data access and sharing across the region and multiple form of data have been a challenge.
- Confusion on meaning of loss and damage

# Priorities

- Enhance regional cooperation for multiple purposes
- Insurance regulations and coordination
- Capacity building for decision making
- Political commitment from data access to support of specific approaches
- Need to be able to deal with uncertainty and to make information and data on loss and damage digestible
- Recognize countries have their own priorities

# Potential responses and strategies

- Use of regional platforms
- Building on existing regional and international platforms and tools, such as those from WMO.
- Use of models like MRC, including for capacity building.
- Coordinated responses and cost-sharing including on expertise
- democratization of data and knowledge
- Create spaces for non-governmental organizations to collaborate.
