The farmers' constituency, which represents millions of farmers from all corners of the world, is highly active in the UNFCCC process and brings a joined-up and multi-disciplinary approach to global agriculture policy processes.

It is clear that the risks posed by climate change have a direct bearing on food security and the development of the economies of our rural areas. Farmers face the twin challenge of producing enough food for the world's growing population while ensuring the livelihoods of those whose subsistence depends on agricultural production.

We therefore welcome the initiative to organize today's Thematic Expert Meeting on Land Use to share experiences on successful implementation of land use actions with climate benefits, explore opportunities for mobilizing finance, technology and capacity-building in efforts to scale up actions.
