Smita Nakhooda is a Research Fellow in the Climate Change Environment and Forests Program at ODI where she leads work on international finance to help developing countries address climate change. This includes efforts to monitor the climate finance, and to understand its effectiveness.

She was previously a Senior Associate in the Institutions and Governance Program at the World Resources Institute, where she led research and engagement programmes on the governance of electricity in major developing countries, and on the environmental impacts of development finance.
