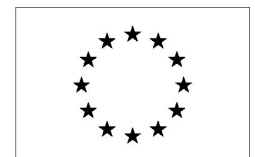


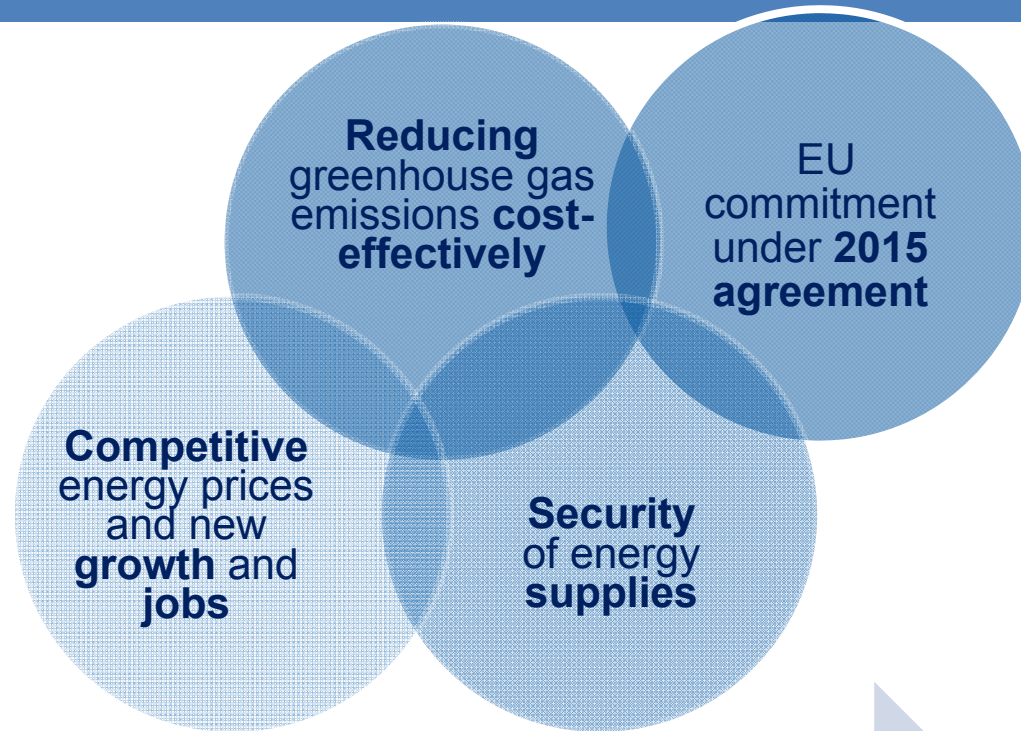

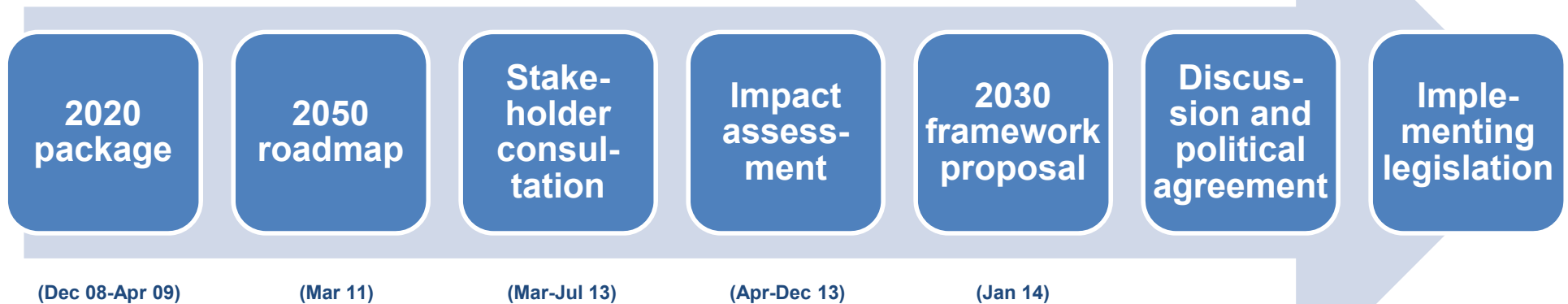

Process



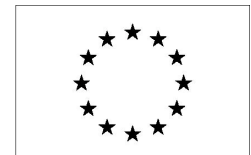
On-going consultations among EU institutions, Member States and stakeholders

Preparations at EU level:

- Stakeholder consultation:
 - Green Paper published by European Commission in March 2013
 - Viewpoints and input sought on a set of 22 questions
 - 557 responses from a broad spectrum of stakeholders
 - High-level stakeholder conference held on 19 June 2013
- Impact assessment :
 - Conducted by European Commission in April-December 2013
 - Range of policy options assessed for headline targets and measures
 - Internal and external expertise mobilised to model scenarios (energy system, non-CO2 emissions, land sector and macroeconomic framework)
- EU Member States preparations in parallel

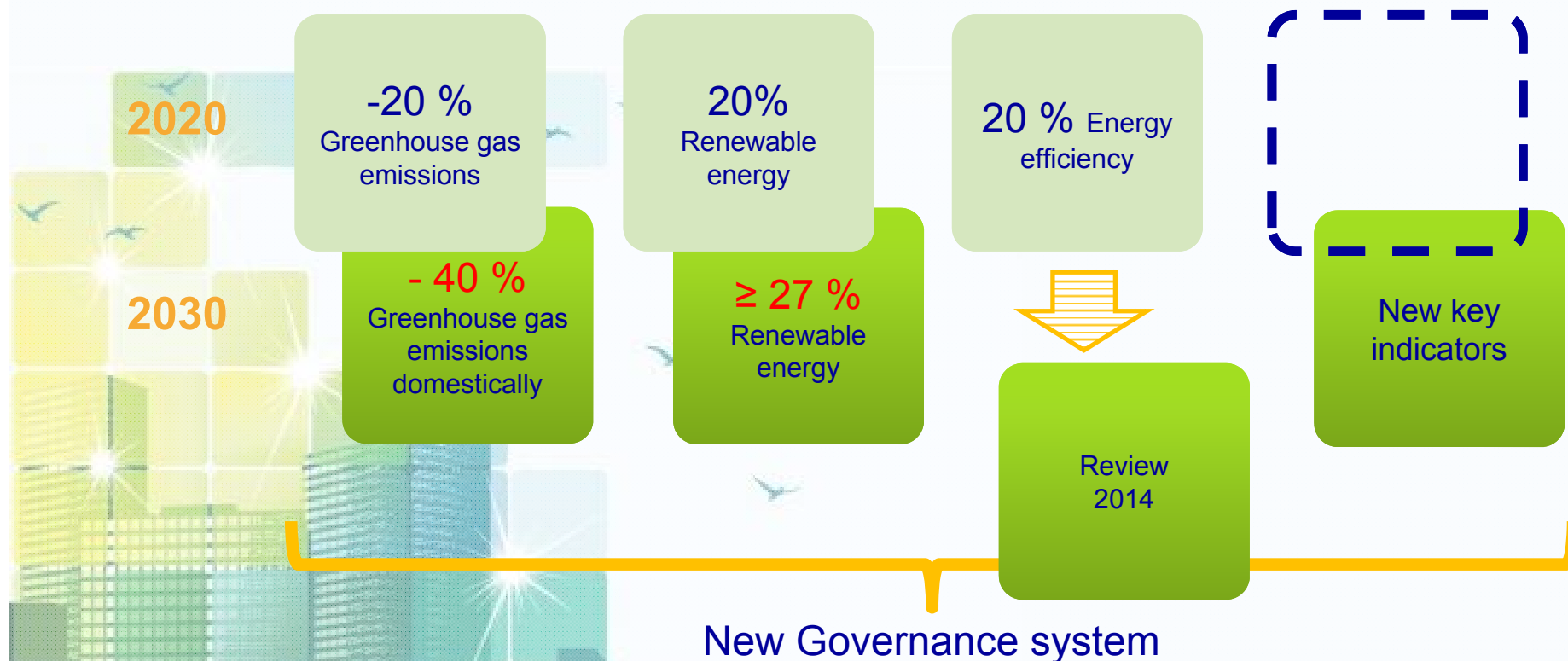
