• One Aim:

 keeping NL a good, safe and attractive place to live and work for present and future generations (→ 2100, long term perspective)

• Two Goals

- Safe, now and in the future (2050-2100)
- Fresh water supply guaranteed, also in dry periods
- Three Basic values:
- Solidarity, Flexibility and Sustainability
- Focus on safety against flooding, fresh water supply and spatial adaptation
- **In advance** of a potential disaster



Highlights of the Deltaprogramme

1. Planning for an uncertain future

- \rightarrow scenario's
- \rightarrow adaptive delta management, risk based strategies

2. Institutional arrangements:

- → 5 Ds among Delta Fund and Delta Act
- → Focusing the decision-making
- 3. Multi-governmental approach

 \rightarrow joined process of strategy development and decision making

 \rightarrow multifunctional measures (\rightarrow added value)






Delta Decision on spatial adaptation

Aim=

- to prepare <u>urban areas</u> on climate change (drought, pluvial floods, heat)
- 2. Improve resilience of <u>vital services</u> (energy, ICT, communications, healthcare.)
 - Joint agreement between national government, provinces, waterboards and municipalities

Integrated measures = Linking agenda's= added value!








Multi-level Governance DP Rivers

Regional approach:

- Connect creative and innovative ideas
- Combine with local economic developments
- Involve local characteristics, knowledge, stakeho and built acceptance
- Joint fact-finding
- Common knowledge base improve quality of inform
- Structured, stepwise process of strategy developm
 Supervised by Delta Program Commissioner
- coherence between regions, uniformity, progress,

The Dutch Delta Program: lessons learned

- A holistic **long term vision**, and related policy objectives, as a common compass
- National policy frameworks + regional strategies

Proces:

- Joint fact finding, joint decision making, structured, multi-governance, stakeholders, science-policy interface
- supervised by independent senior official (progress, uniformity, coherence)
 Strategies: risk and system based, integrated and adaptive
- Measures: multifunctional, flexible ("building with nature")
- Both technological and governance innovations
- Developing and Sharing knowledge building the Delta community
 Continuity:
- Annual report to Parliament (urgency in decision making)
- Act and Fund for legal base and long term stability
