16:00 – 17:30	Bernd Hackmann (UNFCCC) – 15min Secretariats view on the NDC cycle The Paris Agreement recognizes that the long-term goals specified in its Articles 2 and 4.1 will be achieved through time and, therefore, builds on a ratcheting up of aggregate and individual ambition over time. A mandatory cycle of contributions (NDC cycle), starting in 2020, is implicitly established by the core obligation to prepare, communicate and maintain successive NDCs and the requirement for Parties to do so every five years. Bernd will provide a summary of these provisions with a view to clarifying how the secretariat is applying them for the first NDC and subsequent NDCs. Gopal Joshi (UNFCCC) – 15min Operation of the NDC registry In accordance with the Paris Agreement, NDCs communicated by Parties shall be recorded in a public registry. Gopal will provide information on the mandate and approach followed by the secretariat to develop an interim registry, including its features and the submission procedure for Parties. Stéphanie Croguennec – 15min France - experience Stéphanie is working for the French ministry of environment. Her unit takes part in EU Council discussions related to the implementation of the 2030 EU energy and climate framework, which includes the revision of the EU ETS directive as well as new regulations for non ETS sectors and LULUCF sector. My unit followed the preparation of the EU iNDC and prepared the last French NDC of 5 October 2016, covering the contributions of the French overseas countries and territories. Her presentation will include the mains steps of the preparation of the EU iNDC and the more recent FR NDC.
