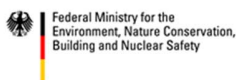
**Venue:** Platz-der-Vereinten-Nationen 1, AHH, Collaboration area

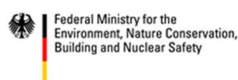

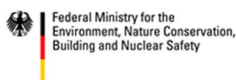
