Mandates for UNFCCC NAMA registry


1/CP.16, paragraph 53 to set up a registry to record nationally appropriate mitigation actions

2/CP.17, paragraph 45 the registry should be developed as a dynamic, web-based platform managed by a dedicated team in the secretariat


Participation is voluntary and the registry contains only information that has been submitted specifically for recording.




Functions of the NAMA Registry

Benefits of participating in the registry

Parties and users have already realized the registry's usefulness as:

Promotion and marketing Platform

- To gain visibility for undertaking climate actions on the ground;
- To increase probability for obtaining international support

Authentic and official source

 of information, data and knowledge on NAMAs, and support needed and available for NAMAs.

Information sharing platform

 For sharing best practices, technical tools and information for designing and implementing NAMAs



The registry could play additional roles

Recording of concrete/specific mitigation actions as per the NDCs and associated support needs;

Support on tracking of implementation of international support commitments for mitigation actions;

Reporting implementation status of mitigation efforts and associated ex-post impacts (emission reductions and sustainable development benefits);

Compiling and sharing best practices-showing what works in terms of investment and support;



Expectations from Parties and users

It is recommended that Parties and others who may benefit from the registry:


- Find ways to increase their level of participation in the registry
- Take steps to ensure that their entries in the registry are accurate, complete and up-to-date
- Continue to provide the secretariat with suggestions for improving the registry, with their related capacity-building needs and to make use of relevant technical resources
- Explore ways to how the registry can serve new climate regime under the Paris Agreement




2. Operational status of the registry in 2017



Participation in the registry






In 2017:

- Users increased by 4%
- About 69% developing countries have access rights as NAMA approvers
- Percentage of countries with access rights in groups:
 - Eastern EuropeanStates (78%)
 - African States (77%)
 - LAC States (67%)
 - Asia-Pacific States (64%)
 - > LDCs (63%)
 - SIDS (45%)



Participation in the registry




In 2017:

- NAMA entries increased by 9%
- Region wise increase of NAMA entries:
 - ➤ LDCs (21%)
 - African States (19%)
 - Asia-Pacific States (12%)
 - ➢ SIDS (22%)
 - Eastern EuropeanStates (0%)
 - ➤ LAC States (2%)
- Only 26 % countries that have access have recorded a NAMA



NAMA entries by type and regional group










Types of financial support and targeted actions





Support required, available and provided

- The total estimated cost of all NAMAs entries: USD 28.85
 billion
- International support being sought: USD 11 billion
 - a) Financial support: USD 9.3 billion
 - b) Technological support: USD 1.6 billion
 - c) Capacity-building support: USD 0.1 billion
- Recorded support sources: 18
- Support provided/matched (18 entries) within the registry: USD
 37.7 million


