Full Sized Projects (\$2 million)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• support projects that are proposed by various partners, in line with national priorities and GEF strategies
Medium Sized Projects (Up to \$2 million)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• promote innovative initiatives by a range of stakeholders, typically smaller scale, and follow expedited procedures for approval.
GEF Small Grants Programme (Up to \$50,000)	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• provides funding for CSOs, including women's and indigenous Peoples organizations, in developing countries for small-scale community-based projects
Enabling Activities	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• facilitate essential communication requirements to Conventions, including preparation of national reporting, strategies and action plans.
Programmatic Approaches	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• support large-scale, integrated partnership initiatives, with a coordinated set of FSPs and MSPs, for larger leverage and impact

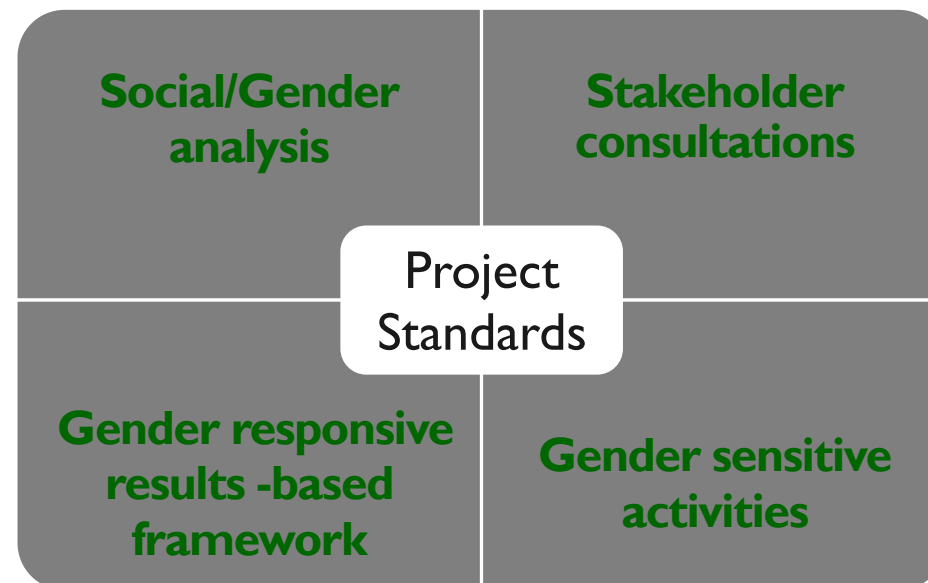

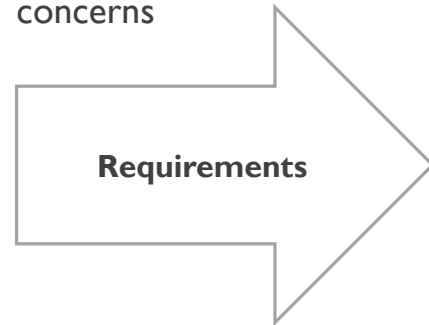




CEO Endorsement stage (example)

Gender responsive stakeholder mapping and consultation

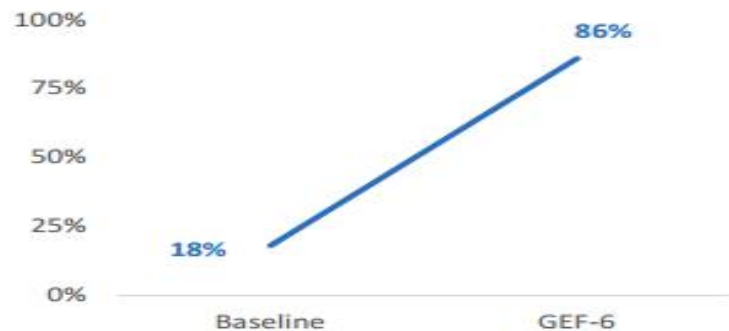
- Conducting inclusive stakeholder /mapping analysis

Gender responsive results based framework

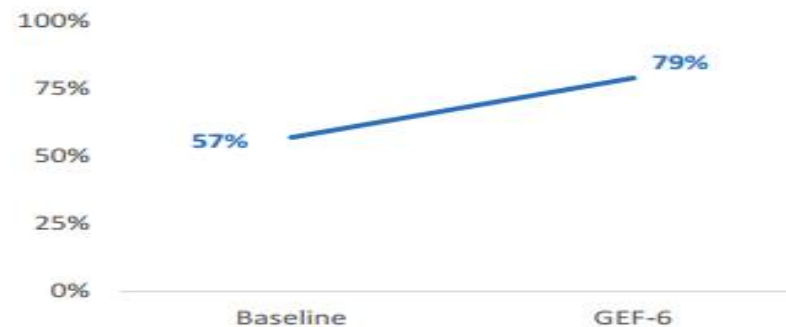
- Linking findings of gender analysis to project theory of change, outcomes, outputs and activities
- Collecting baseline information, developing project sex-disaggregated indicators (e.g. share of women and men as direct beneficiaries)

● Percentage of projects that have incorporated elements of a gender responsive results framework

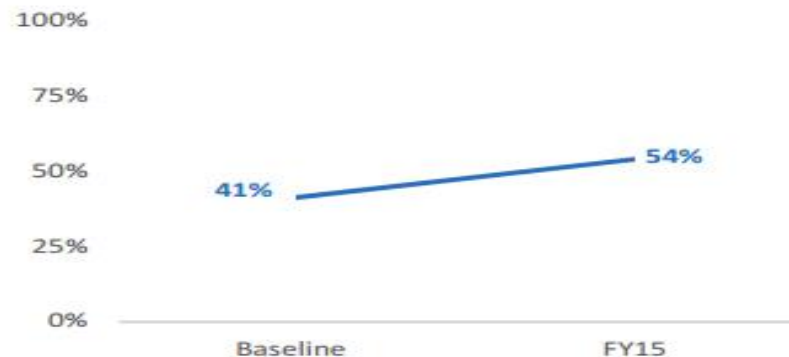


Review of FY15 Monitoring and Evaluation Reports ¹¹

The cohort of projects reviewed consisted mainly of GEF-4 and GEF-5 projects.

● Percentage of monitoring and evaluation reports that incorporate gender

54% in FY15 represents an aggregation of scores 1-3 as presented in the June 2016 scorecard. It is important to note that this analysis is limited to a cohort of projects for which mid-term reviews and terminal evaluations were received during the respective fiscal year.
