

Lessons learned from other action plans

In-session workshop to develop possible elements of gender action plan

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- ❑ Gender action plan in other processes and institutions may offer lessons learned
 - ❑ However, each action plan is context specific and supports a policy or framework or institution that has a particular purpose
 - ❑ Structural differences between action plans applying to projects/programmes and institutional action plan
 - ❑ In the case of the UNFCCC and the Lima work programme on gender, the purpose of the gender action plan is to 'support the implementation of gender-related decisions and mandates under the UNFCCC process'
 - ❑ Actions need to related to the purpose



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- ❑ What elements from other action plans might be useful when thinking about developing the gender action plan?
 - Concepts of strategic priorities and /or thematic issues?
 - Idea of reviewing and reporting on progress?
 - Results-based approach?
 - Identification of gaps / needs on implementation?
 - Collaboration between different actors to achieve implementation?
 - Communicating success and progress of results?
 - Engage with chairs of regional groups, members of constituted bodies on how to integrate gender?
 - Knowledge generation and communication?
