Architecture: three basic elements

1. The Green Climate Fund as the main multilateral financial institution;
2. The designation by each developing country of a national REDD+ coordination entity;
3. An online repository of REDD+ results, to maintain information on developing countries results and track results-based payments.

GREEN CLIMATE FUND

The GCF must assume a main role in the architecture in order to offer developing countries assurances that a substantial part of their REDD+ results will be paid.

NATIONAL REDD+ COORDINATION ENTITIES

Two main functions

1. International level: entities responsible for establishing and signing agreements to obtain and receive payments for results
2. National level: ascribe results to other entities and subnational actors
