Questions with regard to Switzerland:

1. What measures will Switzerland take to ensure a maximum of domestic emissions reduction? (I)

Main national measures (under parliamentary debate):

- CO₂ levy on process and heating fuels
- continuation and further development of the emission trading scheme
- support for renovation of buildings
- technical prescription for new cars
- additional measures may be taken

1. What measures will Switzerland take to ensure a maximum of domestic emissions reduction? (II)

In order to ensure supplementarity, the current legislative proposals discussed in Parliament foresee that:

- 20% emission reductions to be achieved domestically
- ¼ of any additional emission reductions to similarly be achieved domestically

2. Why does Switzerland condition the level of its ambitions on the commitments and actions of other countries?

- The willingness to increase its ambitions depends on the existence of enhanced collective ambition, respecting the principles of responsibilities and respective capabilities.
- By signalling its willingness to increase its ambitions, Switzerland hopes to stimulate ambitions by other countries.
- => race to the top

3. How and when will Switzerland decide on moving above the 20% reduction target?

- The Swiss Parliament will take a decision with regard to the nationally legally binding reduction target, including a flexibility to increase the level of ambition.
- The Swiss Government will decide on the Swiss reduction target within this flexibility, when it has a clear understanding of the form and content of the next phase of the international climate change regime.

4. What is the impact of forests on Switzerland's pledge?

- Future accounting rules for LULUCF must be clearly defined.
- The completion of the review process provides Switzerland as well as other Parties with a clear reference level from which to calculate the emissions and sinks.
- Switzerland's projected reference level for 2013-2020 is a de facto emission of 0.22 mio. tonnes CO₂.
