Development and transfer of technology under SBI

- Technology is in the forefront of the climate change discussion and was a key element of the Dialogue
- At the COP 13 in Bali, the issue of development and transfer of technology (DTT) was also referred to the SBI for consideration

Key activities mandated by decision 4/CP.13 on DTT under SBI

- Requested GEF to elaborate a strategic programme to scale up the level of investment for technology transfer for consideration by SBI 28
- Requested Parties to submit to their views on elements for the terms of reference for the review and assessment of the effectiveness of the implementation of Article 4, paragraph 5 and Article 4, paragraph 1(c) of the Convention

Key activities mandated by decision 4/CP.13 on DTT under SBI

- Decided some important points for funding through existing vehicles and new initiatives:
