

## **Climate Change and Biodiversity**

**An informal joint meeting and reception for participants in the 23<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice of the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (UNFCCC) and the 11<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice of the Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD).**

**Organized by Environment Canada in cooperation with the Secretariats of the CBD and UNFCCC.**

**At the premises of the International Civil Aviation Organization, Montreal**

**November 30, 2005, 7.30pm**

### **Background**

Combating climate change and conserving and using sustainably biodiversity are two of the greatest challenges of the 21<sup>st</sup> Century. Ambitious targets to address climate change and reduce biodiversity loss have been agreed in the frameworks of the UNFCCC and the CBD respectively. But there are major interlinkages among the issues addressed by these two conventions. Climate change is a major driver of biodiversity loss. The conservation and sustainable use of biodiversity, on the other hand, can contribute to both climate change mitigation and adaptation activities.

Canada hosts the secretariat of the CBD in Montreal and, this year, is hosting the eleventh Conference of the Parties of the UNFCCC and the first Meeting of the Parties of the Kyoto Protocol from 28 November to 9 December, 2005. The 23<sup>rd</sup> session of the UNFCCC SBSTA is taking place as part of these meetings. In parallel, the 11<sup>th</sup> session of CBD SBSTTA will take place in Montreal from 28 November to 2 December, 2005. Taking advantage of the coincidence of the meetings of the scientific subsidiary bodies of the two conventions in the same location, Environment Canada is organizing an informal joint meeting for participants in the two meetings.

The aim of the meeting is to further mutual understanding among the participants on the interlinkages between climate change and biodiversity. Respecting its informal nature, there will be no agreed output of the meeting.

### **Programme**

1. The meeting will be opened at 7.30pm by the Chairs of the 23<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice of the UNFCCC and the 11<sup>th</sup> meeting of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific, Technical and Technological Advice of the CBD. They will briefly describe cooperative activities between the two conventions.

Presentations will be made to illustrate interlinkages between biodiversity and climate change, building *inter alia*, on the work of the Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change, the Millennium Ecosystem Assessment, and the ad hoc technical expert groups of the CBD on interlinkages between biodiversity and climate change.
