IAI: intergovernmental organization

- 19 research projects involving close to 300 scientists, 98 institutions in 18 countries in the Americas communicating scientific information to the public & governments.
- **Tropi-Dry network** (Brazil, Canada, Costa Rica, Mexico, Venezuela, USA): researchers in conservation biology, ecology, remote sensing, geographic information systems, sociology, anthropology, policy analysis and forestry.

Success story: scientific data from this project led to overturning a Brazilian State law



Preserving a Forest and a Way of Life

Research into dry forests in Minas Gerais, Brazil, resulted in the protection of more than 16,000 square kilometers of land.


• Between 2007-2011, close to 700 students involved in research projects, 370 of those with scholarships from projects

Tropi-dry project alone has 146 students involved, 116 of those supported with scholarships. Over 1,000 students have participated in training events.
