- Annual greenhouse gas inventory under the UNFCCC and Kyoto Protocol
- Full national communication as determined by COP and CMP
- Domestic reporting requirements




Legislation

Climate Change Response Act

- Reporting under Article 12 of UNFCCC and Article 7 of the Kyoto Protocol
- Specifies functions of inventory agency






Institutional and procedural arrangements for the compilation of NZ's annual inventory

Institutional arrangements

MfE coordinates the inventory development and reporting process




National systems guidelines help build a strong institutional base



Institutional arrangements

MfE coordinates annual compilation of data and projections for 2008 to 2012






All agencies (MfE, MAF and MED) must specify methodologies and assumptions used

National communication

MfE coordinates the national communication

Inventory and projections are part of annual activity

Cross agency approach serves as model for national communication preparation



Developing and retaining expertise

- Regular reporting cycle
- Mentoring
- Development of compiler manuals
- Involvement in UNFCCC expert review process



Lessons learned

- Institutional arrangements with a cross agency approach
- Review feedback and continuous improvement
- Participation in the UNFCCC review process helps develop expertise
- The more frequent, the easier it gets
