ONGOING WORK					
 Following its mandate, the SCF has developed a timeline and determined the objectives and scope of the first BA which take into account elements from the decisions above. The SCF has also developed a proposed outline which is guiding the literature review and the preparation of the first BA. The work plan for the preparation of the first BA rolled out in 2014 and the progress was monitored regularly during its sixth, seventh and eighth meetings. In carrying out its work on the BA, SCF has reviewed internal and external sources of information. Relevant background documents from the sixth to the eighth meetings of the SCF can be found here. The SCF at its eighth meeting agreed on the summary and recommendations by the SCF on the BA, which is now accessible on the SCF website. Members also decided to finalize the full version of the BA in November and publish it before the COP 20 in Lima. More information can be found in the Report of the SCF to COP 20¹.

• The SCF agreed at its eighth meeting that, pending the outcomes of SBSTA and COP deliberations on methodologies for reporting financial information by Parties included in Annex I to the Convention, the SCF stands ready to take forward technical work, should the COP decide to provide the SCF a specific mandate on this issue. The SCF also discussed possible activities that could be taken forward under the framework of its 2015 workplan, with a more detailed work plan on MRV to be developed in 2015 based on COP 20 outcomes.  The SBI is requested to begin the revision of the "Guidelines for the preparation of national communications by Parties included in Annex I to the Convention, Part II: UNFCCC reporting guidelines on national communications" (hereinafter referred to as the reporting guidelines on national communications), based on the experiences gained in preparing the first biennial reports (BR) and other information, with a view to adopting the revised guidelines by COP 20 (2/CP.17, paragraph 18) Annex I Parties are invited to make <u>submissions</u> of views on their experience with reporting the first BR (2/CP.17, paragraph 17), and the secretariat is requested to prepare a technical paper based on these submissions, with the aim of facilitating consideration of SBI 41on the revision of the reporting guidelines on national communication. ONGOING WORK					
 SBI 40 initiated its consideration of the revision of the reporting guidelines on national communications, as requested by COP 17. SBI 40 took note of views submitted by Annex I Parties so far on their experience with preparing their first BR, and recognized that Parties identified inconsistencies between reporting guidelines on national communications and the "UNFCCC biennial reporting guidelines for developed country Parties", and indicated where the reporting guidelines on national communications need to be updated. To enable the SBI complete the revision of NC guidelines by COP 20, SBI 40 invited Annex I Parties that have not yet done so to submit their views on their experiences in preparing their first BRs. SBI 40 also invited Parties to submit their views on the revision of the reporting guidelines on national communications. The secretariat was requested by SBI 40 to include a synthesis of these submissions in the technical paper referred to in decision 2/CP.17, paragraph 20. 					
 The SBI 41 will consider the technical paper³ and recommend a conclusion and a draft decision, as appropriate, on this matter for consideration and adoption at COP 20. SBI 40 noted that, should Parties require additional time beyond SBI 41 to complete this work, event such as workshops for the continuation of this work will be considered at SBI 41.
