## INFORMATION FOR PARTIES

### **Nomination of officers for election to bodies established under the Convention and its Kyoto Protocol**

This is to inform Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change and to its Kyoto Protocol that during the sixteenth session of the Conference of the Parties (COP 16) and the sixth session of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (CMP 6) officers will be elected or appointed to the following bodies:

- The Bureau of the COP and the CMP
- The Bureau of the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI)
- The Bureau of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA)
- The Executive Board of the clean development mechanism (Executive Board)
- The Joint Implementation Supervisory Committee (JISC)
- The Compliance Committee
- The Expert Group on Technology Transfer (EGTT).

Parties are also informed that should the COP and the CMP decide to extend the mandates of the following bodies, officers will also be elected or appointed to these bodies:

- The Ad Hoc Working Group on Long-term Cooperative Action under the Convention (AWG-LCA)
- The Ad Hoc Working Group on Further Commitments for Annex I Parties under the Kyoto Protocol (AWG-KP)
- The Least Developed Countries Expert Group (LEG).

The President of COP 15 and CMP 5 has requested Mr. Andrej Kranjc, Rapporteur of the COP and CMP, to conduct consultations on the nomination of these officers for election, or appointment, as the case may be, on her behalf. The consultations began during the sessions of the subsidiary bodies in June 2010, and will continue during the sessions of COP 16 and CMP 6 in November and December 2010.

The chairs of the Regional Groups/constituencies represented on these bodies are invited to forward nominees for election or appointment. It is recommended that Parties consult within their respective groups/constituencies concerning the nominations. During their consultations, Parties are invited to recall decision 36/CP.7 and give active consideration to the nomination of women for election or appointment to posts in any body established under the Convention or the Kyoto Protocol.

**Distribution:** To Parties through national focal points for climate change.



Following completion of the consultations, the nominations will be forwarded to the COP, CMP or subsidiary body, as appropriate, for election or appointment in accordance with the relevant rules of procedure and decisions of the COP and the CMP. The officers elected or appointed will take office in accordance with the relevant rules of procedure and decisions of the COP and the CMP.

## Annex

**CRITERIA FOR MEMBERSHIP OF BODIES ESTABLISHED UNDER  
THE CONVENTION AND ITS KYOTO PROTOCOL****1. The Bureau of the COP and the CMP**

The draft rules of procedure, being applied, state that “At the commencement of the first meeting of each ordinary session, a President, seven Vice-Presidents, the Chairmen of the subsidiary bodies established by Articles 9 and 10 of the Convention, and a Rapporteur shall be elected from among the representatives of the Parties present at the session. They will serve as the Bureau of the session. Each of the five regional groups shall be represented by two Bureau members and one Bureau member shall represent the small island developing states. The offices of President and Rapporteur shall normally be subject to rotation among the five regional groups.” No officer may serve on the Bureau for more than two consecutive terms of one year.<sup>1</sup>

The Kyoto Protocol provides that: “When the Conference of the Parties serves as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol, any member of the Bureau of the Conference of the Parties representing a Party to the Convention but, at that time, not a Party to this Protocol, shall be replaced by an additional member to be elected by and from amongst the Parties to this Protocol”.<sup>2</sup>

At COP 16, the COP will be invited to elect, for a term of one year, 11 members of the COP and CMP Bureau as follows:

- 2 members representing African States
- 2 members representing Asian States
- 2 members representing Eastern European States
- 2 members representing Latin American and Caribbean States (GRULAC)
- 2 members representing Western European and Other States (WEOG)
- 1 member representing Small Island Developing States (SIDs).

Groups/constituencies are invited to submit nominations to the Bureau of the COP and CMP, bearing in mind the draft rules of procedure and the provisions of the Kyoto Protocol. At the opening of COP 16, the COP will be invited to elect the President of COP 16 and CMP 6. The COP will be invited to elect the other members of the Bureau following completion of the consultations. If any member of the Bureau represents a State that is not at that time a Party to the Kyoto Protocol, at CMP 6, the CMP will be invited to elect for a term of one year a member representing a Party to the Kyoto Protocol to replace such a member.

**2. The Bureaux of the subsidiary bodies established under Articles 9 and 10 of the Convention: the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI), and the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA)**

The draft rules of procedure apply *mutatis mutandis* to the proceedings of the subsidiary bodies. Each subsidiary body shall elect its own Vice-Chair and Rapporteur.<sup>3</sup>

The Kyoto Protocol provides that: “When the subsidiary bodies established by Articles 9 and 10 of the Convention exercise their functions with regard to matters concerning this Protocol, any member of the Bureaux of those subsidiary bodies representing a Party to the Convention but, at that time, not a

party to this Protocol, shall be replaced by an additional member to be elected by and from amongst the Parties to this Protocol".<sup>4</sup>

Groups are invited to submit nominations to bureaux of SBI and SBSTA, bearing in mind the draft rules of procedure and the provisions of the Kyoto Protocol. Following completion of consultations, the SBI and SBSTA, at their thirty-third sessions, will be invited to elect for a term of one year their Vice-Chair and Rapporteur, respectively.

### **3. The officers of subsidiary bodies established pursuant to Article 7(2)(i) of the Convention and Article 13(4)(h) of the Kyoto Protocol: Ad hoc Working Groups under the Convention (AWG-LCA), and the Kyoto Protocol (AWG-KP)**

The rules of procedure of the COP shall apply mutatis mutandis to the proceedings of the subsidiary bodies, including working groups established pursuant to Article 7(2)(i) of the Convention and Article 13(4)(h) of the Kyoto Protocol.<sup>5</sup>

Unless the COP or the CMP decides otherwise, the Chair of any subsidiary body other than those established by Articles 9 and 10 of the Convention shall be elected by that subsidiary body from among the representatives of the Parties present at the session. The Chairs, Vice-Chairs and Rapporteurs of such subsidiary bodies shall be elected with due regard to the principle of equitable geographical representation and shall not serve for more than two consecutive terms of one year.<sup>6</sup>

At its thirteenth session, the COP established the open-ended ad hoc working group (AWG-LCA) to undertake a comprehensive process to enable the full, effective and sustained implementation of the Convention through long-term cooperative action, now, up to and beyond 2012, in order to reach an agreed outcome and adopt a decision at the fifteenth session of the COP. The COP also decided that the Chair and Vice-Chair of the AWG-LCA, with one being from an Annex I Party and the other being from a non-Annex I Party, shall alternate annually between an Annex I Party and a non-Annex I Party.<sup>7</sup> At its fifteenth session, the COP decided to extend the mandate of the AWG-LCA to enable it to continue its work and present the outcome to COP 16.

At its first session, the CMP established the open-ended ad hoc working group (AWG-KP) to consider further commitments for Parties included in Annex I for the period beyond 2012 in accordance with Article 3, paragraph 9, of the Protocol.<sup>8</sup> At its fifth session, the CMP requested the AWG-KP to deliver the results of its work for adoption by the CMP at its sixth session.

The AWG-LCA and the AWG-KP are expected to conclude their work at COP 16 and CMP 6, respectively.<sup>9</sup> Should the COP and/or the CMP decide to extend the mandate of the ad hoc working groups, Groups will be invited to submit nominations to the AWG-LCA and/or AWG-KP, bearing in mind the draft rules of procedure of the COP, and relevant decisions of the COP the CMP. Unless the COP or the CMP decides otherwise, the ad hoc working group(s) will be invited to elect the Chair, Vice-Chair and Rapporteur for a term of one year following completion of the consultations.

### **4. The Executive Board of the clean development mechanism**

The Executive Board comprises 10 members and 10 alternate members. Members and alternate members of the Executive Board are nominated by the relevant groups/constituencies and elected by the CMP. Each year, the CMP elects five members and their alternate members for a term of two years.

Members and their alternates are eligible to serve a maximum of two consecutive terms. Terms as alternate members do not count.<sup>10</sup>

At CMP 6, the CMP will be invited to elect for a term of two years five members and five alternate members to the Executive Board as follows:

- 1 member and 1 alternate member representing African States
- 1 member and 1 alternate member representing Asian States
- 1 member and 1 alternate member representing GRULAC
- 1 member and 1 alternate member representing WEOG
- 1 member and 1 alternate member representing Parties included in Annex I to the Convention (Annex I Parties).

Groups/constituencies are invited to submit nominations to the Executive Board, bearing in mind the time, availability and competencies required of members and alternates sitting on the Executive Board. Parties may also wish to review the annual report of the Executive Board to CMP 4, in which the Executive Board reiterated that “its members must collectively provide the professional and regulatory competence needed to supervise the CDM, which is a mechanism of substantial size, global spread and sectoral diversity” and that members and alternate members “need to invest a considerable amount of time to provide their professional services.”<sup>11</sup>

## 5. The Joint Implementation Supervisory Committee (JISC)

The JISC comprises 10 members and 10 alternate members. Members and alternate members of the JISC are nominated by the relevant groups/constituencies and elected by the CMP. Each year, the CMP elects five members and their alternate members for a term of two years. Members of the JISC may be eligible to serve a maximum of two consecutive terms. Terms as alternate members do not count.<sup>12</sup>

At CMP 6, the CMP will be invited to elect for a term of two years five members and five alternate members to the JISC as follows:

- 2 members and 2 alternate members representing Annex I Parties
- 2 members and 2 alternate members representing Annex I Parties that are undergoing the process of transition to a market economy (Annex I EIT Parties)
- 1 member and 1 alternate member representing Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention (Non-Annex I Parties).

Constituencies are invited to submit nominations to the JISC, bearing in mind that members and alternate members of the JISC shall have recognized competence relating to climate change issues and in relevant technical and policy fields,<sup>13</sup> and the expected time commitments required of members and alternates sitting on the JISC.<sup>14</sup>

## 6. The Compliance Committee

When a member or alternate member resigns or is otherwise unable to complete the assigned term or to perform the functions of a member or alternate member, the Compliance Committee is to

request the CMP to elect a new member or alternate member for the remainder of that officer's term at its next session.<sup>15</sup>

During 2010, the secretariat received two resignations from the Compliance Committee:

- From a member representing Non-Annex I Parties constituency on the facilitative branch
- From an alternate member representing Annex I Parties constituency on the enforcement branch.

The Non-Annex I Parties constituency and the Annex I Parties constituency are invited to submit nominations to the Compliance Committee, including a brief curriculum vitae of each individual nominated, bearing in mind the agreed competencies of the members of the respective branches, in particular:

- a. That the members and alternate members of the facilitative branch shall have recognized competencies relating to climate change and in relevant fields such as the scientific, technical, socio-economic or legal fields;<sup>16</sup>
- b. That the members and alternate members of the enforcement branch shall have legal experience.<sup>17</sup>

Parties are reminded that the nature of the Committee and the particular design and function of the procedures and mechanisms require, for their effective functioning and for the quorum to be met, the availability of members and alternate members for meetings at very short notice (one to two weeks).

Following the completion of the consultations, the CMP will be invited to elect a new member and alternate member to replace the member and alternate member who resigned.

## **7. The Expert Group on Technology Transfer (EGTT)**

At its thirteenth session, the COP agreed to reconstitute the EGTT for a further five years, and to review, at its eighteenth session, progress of the work and terms of reference, including, if appropriate, the status and continuation of the EGTT.<sup>18</sup>

The EGTT comprises 19 experts nominated by Parties to the Convention. The members of the EGTT shall be nominated by Parties to the Convention for a term of two years and are eligible to serve two consecutive terms. Half of the members of the EGTT initially shall serve for a period of three years, taking into account the need to maintain the overall balance of the group. Every year thereafter, half of the members shall be nominated for a period of two years.<sup>19</sup>

Groups/constituencies are invited to nominate for a term of two years 10 members to the EGTT as follows:

- 2 members representing African States
- 1 member representing Asian States
- 2 members representing GRULAC
- 1 member representing SIDS
- 4 members representing Annex I Parties.

The members nominated by Groups/constituencies will be confirmed by the SBSTA.

Groups/constituencies are invited to bear in mind that members of the EGTT shall have expertise in the five thematic areas of the current framework and/or in any of the following areas, inter alia: greenhouse gas mitigation and technologies for adaptation; technology assessments; information technology; resource economics including public and private financing instruments; and social development.<sup>20</sup>

## 7. The Least Developed Countries Expert Group (LEG)

The COP, at its thirteenth session, decided to extend the mandate of the Least Developed Countries Expert Group (LEG) under the terms of reference adopted by decision 29/CP.7, and to review, at its sixteenth session, the progress, need for continuation and terms of reference of the group, and to adopt a decision thereon.<sup>21</sup> The COP also decided that consistent with decision 7/CP.9, paragraph 2, new experts may be nominated to the LEG, or existing members of the group may continue in office, as determined by the respective regions or groups.

The terms of reference of the LEG<sup>22</sup> provides that the LEG comprises 12 experts having recognized competence and appropriate expertise to assist in the development of national adaptation programmes of action (NAPAs). The group shall consist of:

- 5 experts representing African LDC Parties
- 2 experts representing Asian LDC Parties
- 2 experts representing SIDs, which are LDC Parties
- 3 experts representing Parties included in Annex II to the Convention (Annex II Parties).

At least one selected LDC expert and at least one selected expert from Annex II Parties shall also be a member of the CGE. The experts will be selected by the Parties from their respective regions or groups, and shall have expertise in vulnerability and adaptation assessment. Members of the group shall serve in their personal capacity and shall have no pecuniary or financial interest in the issues under consideration by the group.

Should the COP, at its sixteenth session, decide to extend the mandate of the LEG, Groups/constituencies will be invited to nominate members to the LEG in accordance with the terms of reference to be determined by the COP.
