UN Climate Change Secretariat presentation:

Making the Kyoto Protocol work: data, policies and infrastructure + briefing on the expected outcomes of the UN Climate Change Conference in Bali

This month, the UN Climate Change Secretariat based in Bonn, Germany will present detailed emissions data provided by the 41 industrialized nations which are Parties to the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change.

A special focus will be given to progress in combating climate change under the Kyoto Protocol, with a close look at emissions data of Kyoto Protocol Parties. The secretariat will give an overview of which policies and measures have been put in place as a result of the Kyoto Protocol entering into force, what the projected emissions of these countries are likely to be up to the end of 2012 and what technical infrastructure has been put in place by the secretariat to enable emissions trading between Kyoto Protocol Parties, which will begin as of January 2008.

The question will also be answered to what extent the Kyoto Protocol could serve as a blueprint for a future 2012 climate change agreement or set of agreements.

The press briefing will be held in conjunction with a background briefing on the issues to be discussed and negotiated at the United Nations Climate Change Conference: Indonesia 2007 (3 to 14 December).

The information will be presented by UNFCCC Executive Secretary Yvo de Boer and by a team of UNFCCC emission data experts.
