- Aggregate mitigation commitments of all Parties and progress towards achieving those commitments;
- Implementation of commitments under the Convention;
- Economic circumstances and capabilities of the Parties; and
- Cost effective mitigation potentials, clean energy technology and energy efficiency potentials.
