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II. Annotations to the provisional agenda

1. Opening of the session

1. The twenty-third session of the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI) is scheduled to be opened by the Chair on Monday, 28 November 2005.

2. Organizational matters

(a) Adoption of the agenda

2. The provisional agenda for the session will be presented for adoption.

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(b) Organization of the work of the session

3. *Background:* The twenty-third session of the SBI will close on Tuesday, 6 December. It will finalize as many matters as possible and transmit its results to the Conference of the Parties (COP) or the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (COP/MOP).

4. In accordance with Article 15 of the Kyoto Protocol, the subsidiary bodies of the Convention shall serve as the subsidiary bodies to the Kyoto Protocol. The SBI, at its eighteenth session, recommended that, in order to clarify the capacity in which the SBI or the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) is acting, items relating to the Convention and items relating to the Kyoto Protocol should be clearly identified on the agenda of the SBI and on the agenda of the SBSTA and during the meetings of these bodies.¹

5. The session will be organized to account for an extensive agenda and the limited amount of available meeting time. Priority will be given to the most urgent issues. In addition, because of the heavy schedule of work anticipated for COP 11 and COP/MOP 1, the President of the COP and the COP/MOP may not be able to undertake consultations on items on which the SBI could not agree. Items that are not concluded at this session will be forwarded to the SBI at its twenty-fourth session.

6. *Action:* Parties will be invited to agree on the approach to the organization of work for the session.

7. Parties are invited to refer to the proposed schedule contained in annex I to the annotations to the provisional agendas of the COP and the COP/MOP and to consult the Daily Programme for an update on the work of the SBI.

8. Representatives of Parties and international organizations are requested to keep their oral statements as brief as possible. Those wishing to make a written statement available should bring copies for distribution.

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(c) Election of officers other than the Chair

9. *Background:* Pursuant to rule 27 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, the SBI is expected to elect its Vice-Chair and Rapporteur. At the request of the President of COP 10, consultations with the coordinators of the regional groups were initiated at SBI 22, together with the consultations on

the election of members of the other Kyoto Protocol and Convention bodies. If necessary, further consultations will be held during the session. Parties are invited to recall decision 36/CP.7 and to give active consideration to the nomination of women for elective posts in any body established under the Convention or the Kyoto Protocol. The current officers of the SBI will remain in office until their successors are elected.

10. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to elect its Vice-Chair and Rapporteur for its twenty-fourth and twenty-fifth sessions at the earliest opportunity following completion of consultations.

(d) Election of replacement officers

11. *Background:* Pursuant to Article 15, paragraph 3, of the Kyoto Protocol, when the SBI exercises its functions with regard to matters concerning the Kyoto Protocol, any member of its Bureau representing a State that is a Party to the Convention but, at that time, not a Party to the Protocol, shall be replaced by an additional member to be elected by and from among the Parties to the Protocol. If necessary, further consultations with the coordinators of the regional groups will be undertaken.

12. *Action:* If necessary, the SBI will be invited to elect additional officers for its twenty-fourth and twenty-fifth sessions to replace the Vice-Chair and/or Rapporteur representing a State that is not a Party to the Kyoto Protocol.

3. National communications from Parties included in Annex I to the Convention

(a) Options for the review process

13. *Background:* The SBI, at its twenty-first session,² recalled that several reviews of the information submitted by Parties included in Annex I to the Convention (Annex I Parties) under the Convention and under the Kyoto Protocol should take place in 2006–2007. The SBI requested the secretariat to prepare a note on options for streamlining these review processes, in order to avoid possible duplication of effort and to ensure efficient use of available resources.

14. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider the document mentioned below and to provide guidance to Parties and the secretariat on streamlining the review processes in 2006–2007.

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(b) Report on national greenhouse gas inventory data from Parties included in Annex I to the Convention for the period 1990–2003

15. *Background:* The COP, at its eighth session,³ requested the secretariat to provide information relating to greenhouse gas inventory data submitted by Annex I Parties for the consideration of the subsidiary bodies and the COP.

16. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to take note of the information contained in the document mentioned below.

(c) Status report on the review of third national communications

17. *Background:* The COP, by its decision 33/CP.7, requested the secretariat to apply the procedures for the review of national communications, including in-depth reviews, as defined in decisions 2/CP.1 and 6/CP.3, to the national communications submitted by Annex I Parties in accordance with decision 11/CP.4. By August 2005, 35 in-depth reviews of third national communications had been conducted. The third national communications from Luxembourg and Ukraine have not yet been received.

18. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to take note of the status report.

19. *Background:* The Consultative Group of Experts on National Communications from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention (CGE), in implementing its work programme for 2003–2007, envisaged conducting seven training workshops, four of which have been conducted so far. Lessons learned in the development of training materials and the organization of these workshops would be useful for Parties in providing guidance to the CGE on the conduct of the remaining workshops.

20. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to provide additional guidance on the overall work of the CGE for 2006–2007 based on its progress report.

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(b) Compilation and synthesis of initial national communications

21. *Background:* The COP, by its decision 2/CP.9, requested the secretariat to prepare a compilation and synthesis of information contained in all initial national communications from Parties not included in Annex I to the Convention (non-Annex I Parties) submitted to the secretariat by 1 April 2005, for its consideration at its eleventh session.

22. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider the reports listed below and make recommendations on any follow-up action.

23. *Background:* In accordance with Article 12, paragraph 4, of the Convention and decisions 10/CP.2 and 12/CP.4, the secretariat compiles and makes available to Parties a list of projects submitted by non-Annex I Parties. This list has been updated, based on information received in national communications submitted up to 1 September 2005.

24. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to take note of the document mentioned below.

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5. Financial mechanism (Convention)

(a) Special Climate Change Fund

25. *Background:* At SBI 22,⁴ Parties decided to continue consideration of this matter at their twenty-third session, on the basis of the draft text⁵ produced at SBI 22.

26. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to further consider this issue and to recommend a draft decision for adoption by the COP at its eleventh session.

(b) Report of the Global Environment Facility to the Conference of the Parties

27. *Background:* The Memorandum of Understanding between the COP and the Council of the Global Environment Facility (GEF), annexed to decision 12/CP.2, provides, inter alia, that the GEF will make available to the COP annual reports and other official public documentation. The COP, by its decision 8/CP.10, requested the GEF to report to the COP at its eleventh session and at subsequent sessions on how activities identified in paragraph 6 of decision 1/CP.10 have been supported, and the barriers, obstacles and opportunities presented.

28. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider the report of the GEF and recommend a draft decision for adoption by the COP at its eleventh session.

(c) Matters relating to the implementation of decision 5/CP.8

29. *Background:* The COP, by its decision 9/CP.10, requested the secretariat, on the basis of the experience of international funds and multilateral financial institutions, to compile information that is relevant to addressing future investment needs of developing countries for the purposes of fulfilling their commitments under the Convention. The compilation of this information is contained in document FCCC/SBI/2005/INF.7.

30. The SBI, at its twenty-first session,⁶ initiated the third review of the financial mechanism, which is to be completed in 2006. In the context of this review, it invited Parties and intergovernmental organizations to submit to the secretariat, by 15 October 2005, information on their experience regarding the effectiveness of the financial mechanism. The information submitted will be compiled in a miscellaneous document for consideration by the SBI at its twenty-fourth session.

31. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider the information contained in the document mentioned below and to consider any follow-up action that it may deem necessary.

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(d) Additional guidance to the Global Environment Facility

32. *Background:* Several actions relevant to this agenda item are expected to be taken up by the COP at its eleventh session. These may include action on capacity-building under the Convention (item 8 of the SBI 23 provisional agenda and item 4 (d) of the COP 11 provisional agenda), Article 6 of the Convention (item 7 of the SBI 23 provisional agenda), and development and transfer of technologies (item 8 of the SBSTA 23 provisional agenda).

33. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to prepare a consolidated draft decision on additional guidance to the GEF, relating to the actions mentioned above, for adoption by the COP at its eleventh session.

6. Financial mechanism (Kyoto Protocol)

(a) Adaptation Fund

34. *Background:* The COP, by its decision 10/CP.7, established under the Kyoto Protocol the Adaptation Fund financed from the share of the proceeds on clean development mechanism project activities and other sources of funding, to finance concrete adaptation projects and programmes in non-Annex I countries that are Party to the Kyoto Protocol, as well as activities identified in paragraph 8 of decision 5/CP.7.

35. Article 11 of the Kyoto Protocol provides that guidance to the entity or entities entrusted with the operation of the financial mechanism of the Convention, in relevant decisions of the COP, including those agreed before the adoption of the Kyoto Protocol, shall apply *mutatis mutandis*. No guidance relating to the Adaptation Fund has yet been provided to the GEF.

36. *Action:* The mechanism through which the COP/MOP would provide guidance to the GEF Council on the operation of the Adaptation Fund needs to be considered. The SBI will be invited to consider this issue, on the basis of the document mentioned below, and recommend a draft decision for adoption by the COP/MOP at its first session.

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(b) Guidance to the Global Environment Facility

37. *Background:* Several actions relevant to this agenda item are expected to be taken by the COP/MOP at its first session. These may include action on capacity-building under the Kyoto Protocol (item 9 of the SBI 23 provisional agenda and item 8 of the COP/MOP 1 provisional agenda).

38. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to prepare draft decisions for adoption by the COP/MOP at its first session.

7. Article 6 of the Convention

39. *Background:* The COP, at its tenth session, undertook an intermediate review of progress achieved in implementing Article 6 of the Convention and, by its decision 7/CP.10, recognized that it is essential to share experiences and lessons learned, identify specific opportunities for international and regional cooperation, and build partnerships with all sectors of the economy.

40. At SBI 21,⁷ Parties encouraged the prompt start of the first development phase of the Article 6 information network clearing house as presented in document FCCC/SBI/2004/14, and requested the secretariat to advance its work as the host organization for this prototype. At SBI 23, the secretariat will present the prototype to the SBI.

41. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider the reports listed below, with a view to drawing lessons learned from the regional workshops and to deciding on further action, if necessary. The SBI will also be invited to provide further guidance to Parties and to the secretariat on the work relating to the development of the clearing house.

8. Capacity-building under the Convention

42. *Background:* Decision 2/CP.10 requires the SBI to consider, at its twenty-fourth session, steps to be taken to monitor regularly capacity-building activities pursuant to decision 2/CP.7. In order to do that, the issue of capacity-building is put on the agenda of the SBI at this session.

43. *Action:* The SBI may wish to consider this issue and agree on any follow-up action it may deem necessary.

9. Capacity-building under the Kyoto Protocol

44. *Background:* Decisions 2/CP.7 and 3/CP.7 recommended that the COP/MOP, at its first session, adopt a decision containing a framework on capacity-building that reaffirms the frameworks annexed to these decisions with additional reference to priority areas for capacity-building relating to the implementation of the Kyoto Protocol.

45. The SBI, at its seventeenth session,⁸ reiterated the recommendations in paragraph 13 of decision 2/CP.7 and paragraph 8 of decision 3/CP.7. It solicited views from Parties on additional priority areas for capacity-building relating to the implementation of the Kyoto Protocol. These views are compiled in document FCCC/SBI/2005/MISC.3.

46. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to prepare two draft decisions, based on submissions from Parties, for adoption by the COP/MOP at its first session, one for non-Annex I countries and one for countries with economies in transition.

10. Implementation of Article 4, paragraphs 8 and 9, of the Convention

(a) Buenos Aires programme of work on adaptation and response measures (decision 1/CP.10)

47. *Background:* The Government of Saudi Arabia, in a submission⁹ at SBI 22,¹⁰ requested the secretariat to add this item to the provisional agenda of the SBI, in order to continue discussions on decision 1/CP.10, with particular emphasis on expert meetings and workshops requested by that decision.

48. *Action:* The SBI may wish to take any action that it deems appropriate.

(b) Matters relating to the least developed countries

49. *Background:* The COP, by its decision 7/CP.9, decided to extend the mandate of the Least Developed Countries Expert Group and to review, at its eleventh session, the progress, need for continuation and terms of reference of the group, and to adopt a decision thereon at its eleventh session.

50. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider the information contained in the documents listed below, and to review the progress, need for continuation and terms of reference of the group, and to recommend a draft decision on this matter for adoption by the COP at its eleventh session.

11. Administrative, financial and institutional matters

(a) Budget performance for the biennium 2004–2005

51. *Background:* The performance report on income and expenditure for the first 18 months of the biennium has been prepared to inform Parties of the income received, the expenditure incurred and the results achieved as at 30 June 2005. Information on the latest status (as at 31 October 2005) of contributions by Parties to the core budget, the Trust Fund for Participation in the UNFCCC Process and the Trust Fund for Supplementary Activities has also been prepared.

52. At SBI 22,¹¹ Parties decided to discuss this matter further at their twenty-third session, on the basis of a draft text¹² that was produced at SBI 22 and additional information that would be provided to the SBI at its twenty-third session.

53. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to take note of the information contained in the documents listed below and to prepare a draft decision for adoption by the COP at its eleventh session.

54. *Background:* Having considered the programme budget for 2006–2007 proposed by the Executive Secretary, the SBI, at its twenty-second session,¹³ agreed to recommend a budget for adoption by the COP at its eleventh session. Meanwhile, it requested the Executive Secretary to prepare for its twenty-third session a revision to the work programme for the secretariat contained in document FCCC/SBI/2005/8/Add.1 that would contain the mandates for the activities described therein.

55. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to take note of the revised work programme for the biennium 2006–2007 contained in the document mentioned below.

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(c) Institutional linkage of the secretariat to the United Nations

56. *Background:* The COP, by its decision 6/CP.6, approved the continuation of the institutional linkage of the Convention secretariat to the United Nations and noted that this, together with related administrative arrangements, would be reviewed by both the General Assembly and the COP no later than 31 December 2006. By its resolution 56/199, the United Nations General Assembly approved the continuation of the institutional linkage of the Convention secretariat to the United Nations. The document mentioned below has been prepared by the secretariat following consultations with relevant officials of the United Nations as a basis for the above-mentioned review.

57. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider this issue and prepare a draft decision for adoption by the COP at its eleventh session.

59. *Action:* The SBI will be invited to consider whether members of constituted bodies under the Kyoto Protocol could be accorded privileges and immunities appropriate to their functions, with the aim of preparing a draft decision for adoption by the COP/MOP at its first session.
