Addendum

- 1. In addition to the list of intergovernmental and non-governmental organizations contained in document FCCC/CP/2007/2, the secretariat has prepared an additional list of organizations (see annex) whose applications for admission as observer organizations at the thirteenth session of the Conference of the Parties (COP) were received after the deadline of 10 August 2007.
- 2. This additional list of non-governmental organizations (NGOs) has been reviewed by the Bureau of the COP. The members of the Bureau have not raised any objections to the organizations listed and these organizations have been advised of their provisional admittance status for COP 13 and for the third session of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol on the understanding that the final authority for their admission rests with the COP.
- 3. The COP is invited, at its first meeting, to accord observer status to the nine NGOs listed in this addendum.
