<u>Round table on analysis of the means available to Annex I Parties to reach their emission reduction</u> <u>objectives (KP AWG 5.2)</u>

Although it is difficult at this time to assess what should be addressed by the roundtable at KP AWG 5.2, Canada believes that it should at minimum cover aspects of sources/sectors not covered by the workshop at KP AWG 5.1, and it should focus on possible approaches to reducing sectoral emissions. Parties as well as expert organizations including the OECD/IEA Annex I Experts Group, the Centre for Clean Air Policy, the World Business Council for Sustainable Development, Resources for the Future, the Pew Center on Global Climate Change and the World Resources Institute should be invited to participate in the roundtable.

Outcomes of the in-session workshop at KP AWG 5.1 should be taken into consideration in determining the organization of the roundtable as well as the topics to be covered. The outcomes of the roundtable should feed into and inform the ongoing work of the sub-group on LULUCF at KP AWG 5.2.

In conclusion, Canada looks forward to participating actively in the processes of the Bali Road Map and to working constructively with other Parties as we develop a more effective international framework to address climate change and determine our respective contributions to that framework by 2009.
