Addendum

- 1. At its informal meeting held in Bonn, Germany, on 10–14 August 2009, the Ad Hoc Working Group on Long-term Cooperative Action under the Convention considered a revised negotiating text contained in document FCCC/AWGLCA/2009/INF.1. Sections of the text were considered by informal groups with facilitators, with the goal of revising the text further and modifying it in the direction of consolidation and convergence. Document FCCC/AWGLCA/2009/INF.2 presents a suggested reordering and consolidation of elements of the revised negotiating text as prepared by the facilitators. This addendum is intended to serve as a guide to those elements, indicating the sources of the revised text and providing information on the approach to the reordering and consolidation.
- 2. This document contains six annexes, corresponding to annexes I–VI to document FCCC/AWGLCA/2009/INF.2. Each annex contains one or more tables, which provide the following information: (1) the paragraph numbers of the consolidated and/or reordered text; (2) the Parties or groups of Parties that contributed the consolidated and/or reordered material; (3) the corresponding paragraph numbers of the original text contained in document FCCC/AWGLCA/2009/INF.1; and (4) the approach taken to the consolidation and/or reordering of the paragraphs and the rationale behind it.¹

¹ In addition, tables 16, 18 and 20 identify common elements and points of convergence and divergence on issues contained in the sections on provisional financial resources and investment, technology development and transfer and capacity-building, respectively, in document FCCC/AWGLCA/2009/INF.1.

Annex III A

Enhanced action on mitigation

Mitigation [commitments] by [developed country Parties]

This table provides background information on annex III A to document FCCC/AWGLCA/2009/INF.2.

Without prejudging the final terminology, the term 'developed country Parties' used in paragraph 1 (b) (i) of the Bali Action Plan has been used here. This term is presented in brackets because some Parties indicated their wish to use a different term in this context, such as 'Annex I Parties', or 'developed country Parties and other Parties included in Annex I', and some other terms (see paras. 55, 59–63, 65, 66 and 68 of the revised negotiating text). The terminology will need to be finalized by Parties.

For the purpose of the consolidation exercise and without prejudgment on the final form of the text:

- (a) The issues covered in paragraphs 55 and 60–64 are clustered into two categories based on the subject and content of the proposals: "[mitigation commitments or actions]", and "[achieving quantified emission limitation and reduction objectives]". These titles are provisional and they can be changed or deleted later, should Parties so decide;
- (b) The text relating to comparability (paras. 56–59 and 65) has been moved to the very beginning of section III A 1. The sequence of the consolidated subsections in section III A 1 would then be as follows:
- National circumstances and comparability of efforts
- [Mitigation commitments or actions]
- [Achieving quantified emission limitation and reduction objectives]

Paragraph 65 under "approaches to achieve quantified emission limitation and reduction [objectives] [commitments]" is being discussed as a part of the "comparability of efforts". Accordingly, this heading is not used anymore for paragraph 65. All paragraph numbers in columns 2–5 refer to the numbers used in the revised negotiating text (FCCC/AWGLCA/2009/INF.1).

The content of the table follows the existing structure of the text and is only indicative. Parties may have other perceptions and the table may not reflect all convergence and divergence.

Table 20 identifies points of convergence and divergence on the issues in the chapter on capacity building of the revised negotiating text (FCCC/AWGLCA/2009/INF.1).

Convergence is perceived where there are no opposing alternatives or options and where brackets have not been used to record objections to elements of the text. Divergence is perceived where Parties have explicitly stated an objection, or where there are significant alternatives or use of brackets that indicate that Parties object to elements of the text.

The content of the table follows the existing structure of the text and is only indicative. Parties may have other perceptions and the table may not reflect all convergence and divergence.
