Technical briefing by the Chair of the AWG-LCA on historical responsibility as a guide to future action to address climate change

In response to a request made by some Parties during the fifth session of the AWG-LCA, the Chair will organize a technical briefing to enable Parties to receive and share views on the concept of historical responsibility as a guide to future action to address climate change. After a general introduction to the concept and its application in other areas, delegations will make presentations on historical resposnibility and related concepts.

International transaction log interactive exercise

In accordance with decision 12/CMP.1 and as requested by the SBI at its twenty-ninth session, an interactive exercise will be conducted in Salon Mann on **Saturday**, **6 June**, demonstrating the functioning of the international transaction log (ITL) with other registry systems, including the clean development mechanism registry and representative national registries.

With different scenarios participants will learn the concepts behind the ITL and how transactions of Kyoto Protocol units are performed. The event is divided into two parts: a demonstration of the systems and hands-on activities with participants.
