SPECIAL BRIEFING

The UN Secretary-General's High-Level Advisory Group on Climate Change Financing - An Introduction to UNFCCC Parties

The Secretary-General has established a High-Level Advisory Group on Climate Change Financing to study the potential sources of revenue for financing mitigation and adaptation activities in developing countries, and to make progress on this key issue in the course of 2010. The group, under the chairmanship of H.E. Mr. Meles Zenawi, Prime Minister (Ethiopia) and H.E. Mr. Gordon Brown, Prime Minister (United Kingdom) had its first meeting in London on 31 March.

A special briefing will be held on **Sunday 11 April** from 13.00–14.30 to provide an update on the work of the group. The speakers at the event will be Mr. Ato Newai, Chief Economic Advisor to the Prime Minister of Ethiopia; Mr. Pete Betts, Director for International Climate Change, Department of Energy and Climate Change (DECC) of the United Kingdom, and Mr. Mohammad Reza Salamat, Senior Programme Officer, Secretary General's Climate Change Support Team.
