## **Daily Programme**

#### **Opening of the High-Level Segment**

The opening of the high level segment of the twentieth session of the Conference of the Parties and the tenth session of the Conference of the Parties serving as the Meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol will take place in Plenary Lima.

The President of the Plurinational State of Bolivia will lead the national statements of the high-level segment.

Participants are asked to take their seats in Plenary Lima at 09.45 a.m. to ensure that the opening can begin promptly at 10.00 a.m. Parties who have not done so may still collect their tickets from the Information Desk located on Zone B. The tickets must be collected by an authorized member of the delegation.

Exclusively, for the opening of the High Level Segment on Tuesday, 9 December and the presidential segment on the morning of Wednesday, 10 December 2014, access is based on a ticket system. No entry to the plenary is allowed without a ticket. The proceedings can also be followed on the screens in Plenary Cusco and on the CCTV screens throughout the Conference Center.

The high-level segment will continue on Wednesday, 10 December and Thursday, 11 December with statements from other Heads of State and Heads of Government, Deputy Heads of State and Deputy Heads of Government, Ministers and other heads of delegations.

Statements by inter-governmental and non-governmental organizations will be delivered in the afternoon of Thursday, 11 December 2014. Tickets will not be required for other high-level segment plenaries on Tuesday, 9 December and Wednesday, 10 December 2014.

Participants are kindly reminded to consult the CCTV monitors for any last-minute changes. In order to reduce paper consumption, participants are kindly requested to retain copies of documents throughout the sessions.



#### Ministerial Dialogue on Climate Finance

15.00–18.00 Plenary Cusco Open to all participants

As mandated by the Conference of the Parties at its nineteenth session (decision 3/CP.19), an insession high-level ministerial dialogue is being convened under the current COP intended to reflect how the current institutional arrangements and the information tools for climate finance under the UNFCCC are providing countries with the necessary reassurance that international public finance is flowing and is achieving its intended purpose and to further discuss their potential for scaling up funding and investments by engaging different actors.

**H.E. Mr. Manuel Pulgar-Vidal**, President of COP-20, will open the dialogue, and scene setting interventions will be made by **Mr. Hussein Alfa Nafo (Seyny)**, member of the Standing Committee on Finance and co-facilitator of the 2014 biennial assessment and overview of climate finance flows, **Ms. Hela Cheikhrouhou**, Executive Director of the Green Climate Fund and **Ms. Naoko Ishii**, Chief Executive Officer and Chairperson, of the Global Environment Facility. The dialogue will be cofacilitated by H.E. **Ms. Edna Molewa** (South Africa) and H.E. **Mr. Ed Davey** (United Kingdom).

This event is by invitation only and is for Ministers or Heads of Delegation plus 2. All invitations are personal and non-transferable. Invitations can be picked up at the Information Desk, located near the in Zone B of the conference venue.
