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Paper A: Burundi

BURUNDI submission on Capacity Building under the Convention.

Decision 2/CP17 established the Durban Forum for in-depth discussion on capacity-building with the participation of Parties, representatives of the relevant bodies established under the Convention, and relevant experts and practitioners, with a view to sharing their experiences and exchanging ideas, best practices and lessons learned regarding the implementation of capacity-building activities.

While the Durban Forum is a good platform for sharing experiences regarding implementation of Capacity Building, it does not provide the mechanism for translating the lessons learnt into actions on ground.

Burundi would like to take this opportunity to thank the UNFCCCC Secretariat for the organization of the first and the 2^{nd} sessions of the Durban Forum and would take this opportunity to highlight two important elements:

I)**A transparency technical and financial mechanism** is required to ensure further implementation of capacity building framework for:

(a) Ensuring consultations with stakeholders throughout the entire process of activities, from the design of activities to their implementation ,monitoring and evaluation;

(b) Enhancing integration of climate change issues and capacity building needs into national development strategies, action plans and policy;

(c) improving country-driven coordination of capacity-building activities;

(d) Strengthened networking and information sharing among developing countries, especially through South-South and triangular cooperation;

e) Ensuring gender equity

II) An establishment of a capacity building committee under the Convention could emphases effective capacity build decisions implementation at international, regional and national level
