The table aims to identify overlaps and duplication in the negotiating text (FCCC/ADP/2015/1), that is, identical language within a paragraph or subparagraph, as well as language or portions of text that are nearly identical among paragraphs or subparagraphs.

Simple numbers or "para." indicate operative paragraphs, while "pre. para." is used to indicate preambular paragraphs.
