Opening of the Leaders Event

11.00 – Plenary Seine

The Leaders event, to be attended by approximately 150 Heads of State and Government, will be opened in Plenary Seine and presided over by the President of France, His Excellency Mr. François Hollande. The Secretary-General of the United Nations, His Excellency Mr. Ban Ki-moon and his Excellency Laurent Fabius the President of COP21/CMP11 will also be in attendance.

A total of four seats per delegation for holders of secondary red or green badges are guaranteed behind the nameplate of each Party for the opening ceremony of the Leaders Event. Limited additional seats for holders of green badges will also be available at the back of Plenary Seine and in Plenary Loire.

Following the opening of the Leaders Event, Heads of State and Government will be invited to a remembrance photo.

At 12.00 the Leaders Event will resume to hear statements from Heads of State and Government simultaneously in Plenary Loire and Plenary Seine. Delegations are guaranteed four seats in each plenary room for secondary red or green pass holders. There is limited overflow capacity at the back of each plenary. IGOs holders of secondary red or green badges are guaranteed two seats in each Plenary. For NGO constituency members, a limited number of passes are distributed through the respective constituency focal points.

The proceedings can also be followed on [webcast](#) and on the CCTV screens throughout the Conference Center as well as in rooms Le Rhin, Le Rhone, La Garonne, La Charante, and Le Maroni for those without secondary badges.

The list of speakers in each meeting room has been established in accordance with the time of inscription in the list, and reflecting protocol order in accordance with United Nations practice, with Heads of State speaking before Heads of Government.

Parties are reminded that the duration of statements will be limited to ensure that all speakers have an opportunity to address the event. Each statement is limited to three minutes.

Parties are requested to note that the secretariat is not in a position to accommodate individual requests for changes in a Party's speaking slot.

Sustainability and climate neutrality of the conference

Reduce – Re-use – Recycle

The Government of France has set itself the objective of organizing the Paris sessions as an exemplary conference in terms of sustainability, by re-using and recycling all materials and using as little energy as possible.

The 3 R's of COP 21/CMP 11 are as follows:

- Reducing consumption of resources as an intelligent response to energy needs;
- Re-using (or renting) the furniture, structures, material and lighting used;
- Recycling (zero-wastage strategy).

In order to offset the emissions that cannot be avoided and to ensure that the Paris sessions are a “carbon neutral” event, the Government of France will finance one or more emissions reduction projects.

Become Climate Neutral Now!

Visit the UNFCCC Climate Neutral Desk on the “Champs Élysées” near the UN Information Counter where participants can calculate and purchase offsets immediately. Participants doing this will receive a lanyard for their badge, showing that they are climate neutral.

UNFCCC's [Climate Neutral Now](#) initiative offers all participants the possibility to become climate neutral by using UNFCCC certified offsets from the Clean Development Mechanism to compensate for the climate footprint related to their attendance at the conference.
