Daily Programme

High-Level Segment

The high-level segment will continue hearing statements from ministers and other heads of delegations on the morning of Tuesday, 8 December 2015 in joint meetings of the COP and CMP. The high-level segment will conclude on the afternoon of Tuesday, 8 December 2015 with statements by inter-governmental and non-governmental organizations.

All speakers are reminded that they should be present in the plenary at least ten minutes before (or two speakers ahead of) their presentation.

Representatives are reminded that **statements made during the high-level should not exceed the three-minute limit**, as decided by the Conference of the Parties at its first plenary meeting. Given the number of Parties and the limited amount of time available for statements, it will be necessary to limit the duration of each statement. In fairness to all speakers, time limits will be strictly enforced. It is suggested that statements be as brief and concise as possible. **A bell system will be used during the delivery of statements. The bell will sound at three minutes and will continue to sound every thirty seconds until the end of the statement**

Parties are encouraged to reduce oral statements to the 3 minute limit on the understanding that the full version of their statements will be posted on the UNFCCC website.

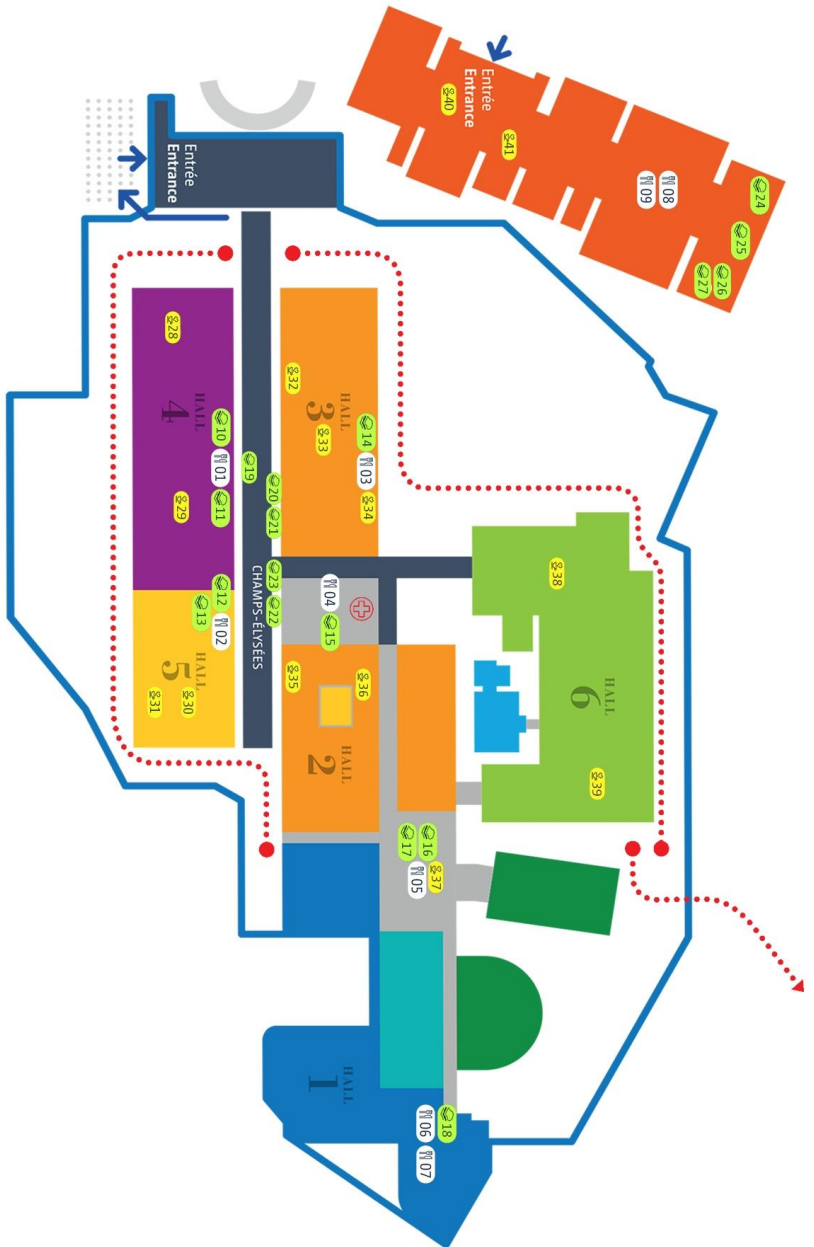

This past September, the UNFCCC launched Climate Neutral Now, a new initiative that fosters demand for voluntary cancellation of emissions reductions and raises awareness about the need for a climate neutral world. The initiative urges individuals, companies and governments to measure their climate footprint and reduce their greenhouse gas emissions as much as possible. Then, people can offset their remaining unavoidable with UN-certified emissions reductions through an online platform developed by the Executive Board of the Clean Development Mechanism.
