High Level Segment

The high-level segment, to be attended by Heads of State and Heads of Government, ministers and other heads of delegations, will continue on the morning of Wednesday, 16 November 2016.

Statements will be heard in joint meetings of the COP, CMP and CMA. National Statements will continue in the morning of Thursday, 17 November 2016 and conclude with statements by inter-governmental and non-governmental organizations in the afternoon of Thursday, 17 November 2016.

All speakers are reminded that they should be present in the plenary at least fifteen minutes before (or three speakers ahead of) their statement.

Representatives are reminded that statements made during the high-level should not exceed the three-minute limit, as decided by the Conference of the Parties at its first plenary meeting. Given the number of Parties and the limited amount of time available for statements, it will be necessary to limit the duration of each statement. In fairness to all speakers, time limits will be strictly enforced. It is suggested that statements be as brief and concise as possible. A bell system will be used during the delivery of statements. The bell will sound at three minutes and will continue to sound every minute until the end of the statement

Parties are encouraged to reduce oral statements to the 3 minute limit on the understanding that the full version of their statements will be posted on the UNFCCC website.

High-Level Ministerial Dialogue on Climate Finance: A multi-stakeholders approach to mobilization and delivery of adaptation finance

15.00–18.00 Plenary Casablanca

Further to the Conference of the Parties mandate from its nineteenth session (decision 3/CP.19), the second biennial High-Level Ministerial Dialogue on climate finance will be convened. It will be informed by the 2016 biennial assessment and overview of climate finance flows, and will discuss adaptation finance, the need to support developing country Parties, cooperation on enabling enhanced environments and support for readiness activities.

The inaugural session will include an opening address by H.E. Mr. Salaheddine Mezouar, President of COP 22/CMP 12/ CMA 1, and keynote addresses by Mr. Ban Ki-moon, Secretary-General of the United Nations, Ms. Ségolène Royal, Co-Chair of the CPLC High-Level Assembly and Ms. Patricia Espinosa, Executive Secretary, UNFCCC. The Dialogue will be structured around high-level panels, keynote addresses and interactive discussion.

"Touch-to-collect" technology (Poken)

In line with the sustainability efforts for COP 22/CMP 12/CMA 1, innovative "touch-to-collect" technology (Poken) is deployed by the host country. Poken is a platform for collecting digital information and networking in a user-friendly way.

Participants can receive a personal Poken device, at no charge, at the Poken distribution counters located inside the side events and exhibits hall (Area E) and in the Moroccan Pavilion (Area D). Poken, once registered with personal login information, allows collecting digital information from the official exhibits, the side events and the Moroccan Pavilion, as well as recent secretariat's publications and daily reports by observer organizations.

The registration of personal login information also allows an exchange of digital business cards among participants holding a personal Poken device. Once collected information is loaded on participants' computer and the conference is over, Poken devices are no longer needed. Participants are invited to contribute to sustainability by recycling their Poken device on the last day.
