


A POTENTIAL CONVENING OR COORDINATING BODY

<u>Possible elements for the terms of reference</u> of a potential convening or coordinating body that may provide secretarial services to facilitate

The primary responsibility of the SNLD coordination body and secretariat

Facilitate and coordinate SNLD members in providing technical assistance and other support related to loss and damage approaches through the implementation of the agreed functions of the SNLD.

Respond to requests by developing country Parties either by itself or by identifying the appropriate organizations in the SNLD in consultation with the requesting developing country Party.





Experience and expertise.



Long term commitment



Financial and fiduciary capacity.



Understanding, experience and expertise in working on loss and damage



Related policy and technical assistance and support areas at the national, regional, and/or multilateral levels in the context of the Convention and the Paris Agreement.



Challenges and opportunities within developing countries.



Understanding of regional, sub-regional and sectoral issues and their differences.



Long term commitment to serve as the coordination body and secretariat for the SNLD.



with demonstrated capacity to provide the necessary administrative and infrastructure support for the effective functioning of the SNLD
