



Authorization: changes and revocation

Authorization

- Throwback to session 1: Authorization (A6.2) Scope 1 vs 3:
- 14. *Decides* that any changes [and/or revocations] to an authorization [of a cooperative approach] [of the use of ITMOs] shall not apply to or affect internationally transferred mitigation outcomes that have already been first transferred;
- Internationally Transferred Mitigation Outcome: in a strict literal sense only exist once all attribute within the name have been fulfilled, including the international transfer
- BUT an authorization can create important forward looking rights for private entities before the ITMO existence moment is reached
 - Recorded in authorization (form), initial report, table 2 within AEF etc.

Authorization no change timing trigger

17. *Decides* that any changes [and/or revocations] to an authorization [of a cooperative approach] [of the use of ITMOs] [should] [shall] not apply to or affect internationally transferred mitigation outcomes that have already been [first transferred] [AUTHORIZED], [unless otherwise agreed and made publicly available by the participating Parties in a cooperative approach [or unless made by a participating Party under extreme circumstances]];

Authorization change triggers

- 17. *Decides* that any changes [and/or revocations] to an authorization [of a cooperative approach] [of the use of ITMOs] [should] [shall] not apply to or affect internationally transferred mitigation outcomes that have already been [first transferred] [AUTHORIZED], [unless otherwise agreed and made publicly available by the participating Parties in a cooperative approach [or unless made by a participating Party under extreme circumstances]];
- Made publicly available by the participating Parties
 - Within the authorization document itself
 - Or wider arrangements covering the cooperation (e.g. bilateral agreement)
- Under extreme circumstances
 - Too broad: CMA to specify concrete trigger events (e.g. evidenced human rights violations, fraud, ...)
