Guidance on TNAs

Mandate (17/CP.20):

The COP 20 requested the TEC to provide guidance on how the results of the TNAs, in particular the TAPs, can be developed into projects that can be ultimately implemented, and to provide an interim report on its preliminary findings to the SB-43 sessions (November–December 2015);



Rolling work plan of the Technology Executive Committee for 2014–2015:

2. Work on technology need assessments

Deliverables:

- **2.1 Review** of technology needs assessments (TNAs), technology action plans (TAPs) and project ideas, and progress in the implementation of the results of TNAs, and
- **2.2 a. Guidelines** to assist Parties in implementing the results of TNAs



State of the work (I)

Works on:

- The deliverable 1 "Review, and identify good practices and lessons learned of the guidance of technology action plans and projects of various stakeholders", and
- The deliverable 2 "Review the guidance of technology action plans and project ideas used in the global TNA project", are currently undertaken by the task force.

These will be followed in June by initiating the work on

• The deliverable 3 "Review technology action plans and project ideas of the global TNA project. Compare them with implemented action plans and project ideas of other stakeholders".

The TEC task force will report on its work to the TEC at its 11th meeting in September 2015.
