With the completion of the Paris Agreement's rulebook, Parties further emphasized the **key role of technology development and transfer** in keeping the 1.5 degrees goal within reach.







COP outcomes relevant to the worf of the TEC

TEC-CTCN joint annual report 2020 and 2021 (Dec. 9/CP.26)

- Invites TEC and CTCN to strengthen their collaboration and the provision of feedback between them with a view to ensuring coherence and synergy and effective implementation of the mandates of the TM, inter alia by exploring the preparation of a joint programme;
- Encourages the continuation of the collaboration between the TM and the FM;
- Encourages the TEC to continue using Technology Day events to strengthen the impacts of its work and to reach target audiences
- Looks forward to TEC's continuing efforts to mainstream gender considerations in its work;
- Encourages the TEC to further increase its activities on outreach and stakeholder engagement to disseminate its policy and publications

GCF report to the COP (Dec. 6/CP.26)


