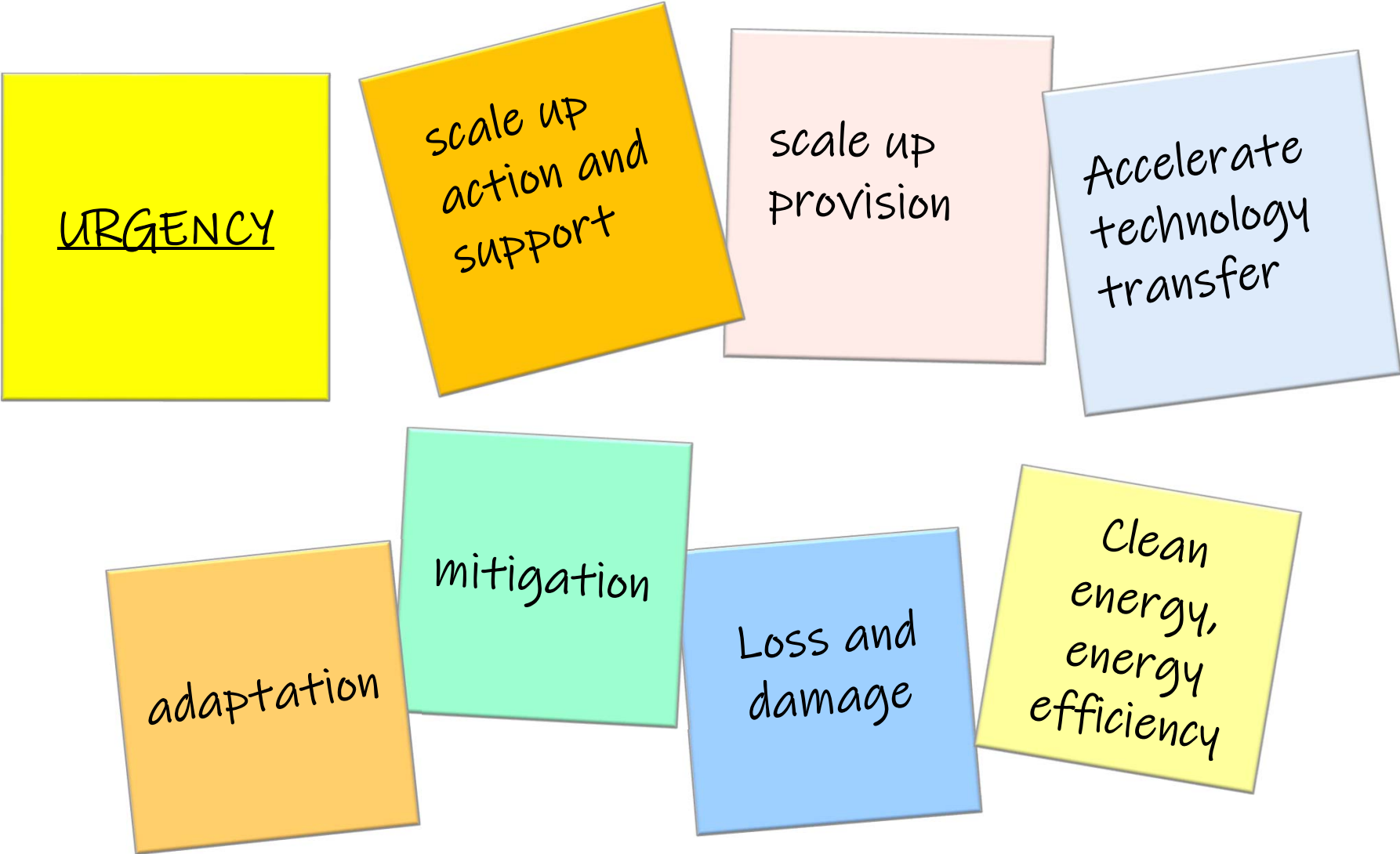

## COP outcomes relevant to the work of the TEC

---

### TEC-CTCN joint annual report 2020 and 2021 (Dec. 9/CP.26)

- Invites TEC and CTCN to **strengthen their collaboration** and the provision of **feedback between them** with a view to ensuring coherence and synergy and effective implementation of the mandates of the TM, inter alia by exploring the preparation of a **joint programme**;
- Encourages the continuation of the **collaboration between the TM and the FM**;
- Encourages the TEC to continue using **Technology Day events** to strengthen the impacts of its work and to reach target audiences
- Looks forward to TEC's continuing efforts to **mainstream gender considerations** in its work;
- Encourages the TEC to further increase its activities **on outreach and stakeholder engagement** to disseminate its policy and publications



## COP outcomes relevant to the work of the TEC

---

### TEC-CTCN joint annual report 2020 and 2021 (Dec. 15/CMA.3)

- Invites TEC and CTCN to:
  - a) Continue their **work on technology and NDC** in 2022–2023;
  - b) Enhance their efforts to ensure full and **effective implementation of the technology framework** through their respective workplan and programme of work.



## COP outcomes relevant to the work of the TEC

---

### GCF report to the COP (Dec. 6/CP.26)

- Encourages **further collaboration and engagement between the GCF, the CTCN and the TEC**, through continued joint work, as well as collaboration on events, and taking into consideration elements related to gender mainstreaming and observer engagement.

### GEF report to the COP (Dec. 7/CP.26)

- Urges the GEF to enhance its support for projects that engage with stakeholders at the local level, and to continue to provide **funding for projects related to technology training and scale up South–South cooperation and triangular cooperation with the TEC and the CTCN**
