
The global stocktake under the Paris Agreement: Contribution by the Technology Executive Committee

What contribution is expected from the TEC and how it will be considered?

- TEC was invited by the CMA to prepare a synthesis report as an input to the GST (19/CMA1, para 24)
- It is likely that the SYR by the TEC will be considered in three installments (one at each TD) → the SYR could have
 addenda; each installment should be delivered three months before the relevant TD (e.g., March 2022, August 2023,
 March 2023)

What information is needed?

- Information for taking stock of the implementation of the Article 10 of the Paris Agreement to assess collective
 progress on this matter → aggregated information both backward (reported) and forward (communicated) looking
 (no individual/ group of Parties information)
- The information identified in 19/CMA.1, para 36. For example information on:
 - Overall effect and progress in implementation of NDCs (complementing the SRY by the secretariat)
 - The state of adaptation efforts, support, experience and priorities (complementing the SYR by the AC)
 - Technology barriers and challenges faced by developing countries, including based on the outputs of the periodic assessment of the Technology Mechanism (16/CMA.1) (para 36 (f))
 - Good practices, experiences and potential opportunities to enhance international cooperation ... (para 36(g))



What is the approach taken by other constituted bodies?

- The Adaptation Committee agreed to await and subsequently consider the guiding questions to be issued by the SB Chairs, and
 at its 20th meeting (7-10 September 2021) to agree on an outline and possible ways to engage other bodies and Parties in the
 development of its report.
- The Consultative Group of Experts agreed to make a submission potentially addressing areas identified in decision 19/CMA.1, paragraph 36 (f) and (g) and drawing on its previous work, including its "CGE Technical Paper 2020 Distilled"
- The Least Developed Countries Expert Group agreed to synthesize information on progress made in the formulation and implementation of national adaptation plans (NAPs), drawing on annual NAP progress reports and the compilations of lessons learned and good practices
- Specific guiding questions (examples) non-paper by the SB Chairs to be made available in May-June 2021
 - What is the overall progress made towards achieving the long-term vision referred in Article 10.1?
 - What are the opportunities and good practices and challenges to enhance technology development and transfer taking into account the provisions of article 10 of the Paris Agreement?
