TEC 23 started its work Tuesday last week



Progress was made in several areas of TEC rolling workplan:



- Key messages and recommendations for COP 26 and CMA 3 on international collaborative research, development and demonstration;
- Technical paper on emerging climate technologies in the energy supply sector (to be finalized and published in Q4 2021);
- Initial concept of compilation of good practices and lessons learned in **setting up** and implementing National Innovation systems (to be produced in 2022);
- Update on Technology Day on Innovative approaches for adaptation technologies. Next session on oceans and coastal technologies in October 2021.

IMPLEMENTATION

- Key messages and recommendations for COP 26 and CMA 3 on innovative approaches to stimulate the uptake of innovative climate technologies;
- Technical paper on linkages between Technology Needs Assessment process and Nationally Determined Contribution process (to be finalized and published in Q4 2021);



ENABLING ENVIRONMENT AND CAPACITY-BUILDING

- Key messages and recommendations for COP 26 and CMA 3 on enabling environment to promote endogenous capacities and technologies;
- Technical paper on enabling environments and challenges to technology development and transfer identified in TNAs, NDCs and CTCN technical assistance (to be finalized and published in Q4 2021);





SUPPORT

- Inputs to the Standing Committee on Finance on draft guidance for the operating entities of the Financial Mechanism (to be shared with SCF after TEC 23);
- Initiated preparation of a technical paper on 'Experiences, lessons_learned and good practices from GCF and GEF's support for technology' (to be finalized at TEC 24).



GENDER MAINSTREAMING

- Achieved **50/50 gender representation** in panels of TEC events in 2021;
- TEC task forces showed greater attention to gender issues in the implementation of their activities
- TEC welcomed invitation of the secretariat's Gender Team to co-organized, together with CTCN, an event on gender & technology in Glasgow
- The TEC gender focal point will submit to TEC 24 ideas for the development of a paper on gender & technology as well as on methodologies for gender mainstreaming, possibly in collaboration with CTCN



TEC 23 also considered the **following**:

- Input to the Global Stocktake under the Paris Agreement:
 TEC agreed on scope and sources of its inputs for preparing its synthesis report for the GST (synthesis report to be considered at TEC 24);
- Monitoring and evaluation (M&E) of the impacts of the work
 of the TEC: the TEC took note of the current M&E status of its
 work.
