Development of the rolling workplan of the Technology Executive Committee for 2023- 2027

Background

- Current TEC rolling workplan for 2019-2022 will end soon
- TEC24 initiated consideration of a new rolling workplan for the next period
- TEC agreed to launch a call for submissions (6 April – 15 May 2022), inviting observers to provide inputs to develop the new rolling workplan (full submissions are available in TT:CLEAR)
- It also agreed to establish an ad hoc task force to take forward the work on this matter, with a view to presenting a draft rolling workplan for consideration at TEC 25
- TEC24 also discussed COP26 guidance on the development of a joint work programme for the Technology Mechanism to enhance the coherence and synergy of the work

Inputs considered in drafting TEC workplan 2023-2027 :

- Relevant COP and CMA decisions, and guidance from the Technology Framework that have not been considered in the current workplan
- Findings and reports of IPCC, including the Special Working Group III contribution to the Sixth Assessment Report that contains a specific chapter on innovation and technology development and transfer
- Previous work of the TEC
- Inputs from stakeholders and observers from the Call for Inputs
- Outcomes of TEC24 identifying potential activities to be considered under the new workplan;
- Joint activities TEC and CTCN for 2022–2023 and opportunities to enhance collaboration and synergize the work of the Technology Mechanism
- Draft CTCN Programme of Work for 2023-2027
- Inputs from CTCN secretariat and CTCN AB members
- Additional inputs from taskforce members.

Guiding principles of the new TEC workplan:

- a) Be responsive to Parties guidance
- b) Be aligned with mandates and functions of the TEC
- c) Embedding components of Technology Framework in activities of the TEC
- d) Be informed by science and be transformative
- e) Supporting NDC implementation and ambition
- f) Contributing to the achievement of climate goals and SDGs
- g) Be gender-responsive
- h) Be mindful of resource implications

In the implementation of the new workplan the TEC will ensure:

- a) CTCN engagement and systematic feedback
- b) Stakeholders engagement
- c) Communication and outreach
- d) Gender mainstreaming
- e) Monitoring and evaluation
- f) Review of the workplan

Structure of the new workplan:

Workstream 1: National systems of Innovation and Collaborative Research, Development and Demonstration and General Purpose Technologies

Workstream 2: Technology need assessment and technology roadmapping to support NDC implementation

Workstream 3: Transformative and innovative solutions

Workstream 4: Collaboration and engagement with other UNFCCC constituted bodies and processes and other UN agencies.



The TEC is invited to:

Consider the draft and provide guidance for the Chair and Vice-Chair of the TEC to finalize the rolling workplan for 2023-2027

Specifically, the TEC is invited to:

- a) Consider and elaborate further on **potential activities** and corresponding **deliverables**;
- b) Determine the **timeline** of activities to ensure appropriate distribution of work of the TEC in the span of five-year period;
- c) Identify **potential partner organizations** to collaborate in implementing the activities of the workplan;
- d) Identify potential activities that could be undertaken **jointly or in complementarity with the CTCN** to enhance synergies and impacts of the work of the two bodies.

Process during TEC 25:

- Part I – Introduction, general discussion, clarification (Day 1 – 6 Sept)
- Part II – Break out groups to discuss detailed activities, deliverables, timelines and report back from break out groups (Day 2 – 7 Sept)
- Part III – Final discussion (Day 3 - 8 Sept)
