# **Background**

- COP21 and COP23 decisions: TEC to engage in technical examination processes on mitigation and adaptation (2016-2020)
- Implementation of Technology Framework (2019-present): TEC to work in open and inclusive manner:
  - ✓ stakeholders are invited to actively engage and provide inputs
  - engagement of stakeholders at the local, regional, national and global level
  - ✓ with NDEs, academia, private sector, local communities and authorities, civil society organizations, initiatives, international organizations



# Outputs – related to TEP (2016-2020)

- Inputs to the AC and High-level Champions
- 9 Regional technical expert meetings in conjunction with the regional climate weeks (engaging NDEs, CTCN network, 50 organisations working in the regions, MPGCA)
- 3 Recommendations to Parties on policies to accelerate the implementation of technology solutions
- Inputs to COP 24 & COP 25 stocktake on pre-2020 implementation and ambition










# Outputs – Technology framework implementation

- Collaboration with WIM Excom: Expert dialogue on technologies for averting, minimizing and addressing loss and damage in coastal zones – June session 2019
- Joint policy brief (contribution by 20 experts)





Collaboration with **PCCB**: Dialogue to promote shared understanding of endogenous concept at Capacity-building Hub @COP25



# Outputs – Technology framework implementation

Stakeholder engagement across all thematic areas:

- 20 representatives of observer organizations in TEC taskforces
- Numerous engagement of UN agencies, international organizations, observers, academia/research, business and private sector in events



#### **Impacts**

- Recognition of the roles of the TEC (e.g.TEP Summary for Policy Makers 2021, HLC Implementation Lab)
- Enhanced visibility (incl. in the region)
- Invitation to collaborate: G-STIC 2022, IUCN-FEBA and NWP
