Note from the President of COP 5 High-level segment

In keeping with the recommendations of SBI 10, the high-level segment of this fifth session of the Conference of the Parties will include the following:

Presentation of policy statements

Ministers and other heads of delegation will have an opportunity to present brief policy statements on Tuesday 2 November, from 15.00 hrs to midnight, in Plenary I (**Saal Maritim**). Speakers are urged to make their statements brief (3 minutes) in accordance with the decision adopted in the plenary on Wednesday 27 October.

Exchange of views

The exchange of views will take place in Plenary I (**Saal Maritim**) on Wednesday 3 November from **10.00 - 13.00** hrs. and from **15.00 - 18.00** hrs. It will continue on Thursday 4 November, from **10.00 - 12.00** hrs.

This exchange of views is a new initiative that seeks to respond to the interest expressed by some ministers in engaging in an informal exchange of views. Two topics have been agreed to focus the discussions:

- (a) Progress made in dealing with climate change: lessons and challenges; and
- (b) The way forward: promoting implementation of the Buenos Aires Plan of Action and early entry into force of the Kyoto Protocol.

The topics will be taken up one after the other. In the interest of promoting a vigorous and varied exchange of views on the topics, the President would like to suggest that interventions be brief (2 minutes). Such a lively exchange would not lend itself to the delivery of prepared statements. All Parties who have points to register will be able to do so, within the allotted 8 hours of meeting time. All ministers and heads of delegation are encouraged to share their experiences and perspectives. The presiding officer will manage the requests for the floor in a way that will promote interaction, debate and dialogue.

Each delegation will have two seats assigned - one at the microphone and the other immediately behind. Such an arrangement will ensure that all ministers and heads of delegation are seated closer together in the centre of the room, in a setting more conducive to spontaneous and dynamic discussion. There will also be additional seating around the room for other members of delegations.

Representatives from observer States, international organizations and non-governmental organizations will be able to attend and listen to the exchange of views.

Lists of speakers for the high-level segment attended by ministers and other heads of delegations

The list below is the list of speakers that wish to deliver a policy statement under agenda item 10 at the high-level segment (scheduled for 15.00 to completion on Tuesday 2 November).

All speakers are reminded to be present in the plenary at least ten minutes (two speakers) prior to their presentation. They will be escorted by an usher during the presentation of the previous speaker from the seat of their delegation to a reserved chair close to the podium. Should a speaker not be present at his/her delegation's seat at the appropriate time, a slot may be assigned at the end of the day's proceedings (upon request of the delegation).

Delegates are reminded that statements during the high-level segment should not exceed the three to four minute limit to which the Conference agreed at its third meeting. Parties are encouraged to consider consolidating individual statements into one statement made on behalf of a group of Parties, in which case a time limit of five minutes will apply. Given the large number of statements, we kindly suggest that statements be as brief and concise as possible, with full texts available for distribution (see below for the quantities required). If Parties do not wish to speak but would prefer only to have their statements circulated, the secretariat will make arrangements to distribute the copies and enter the statement in the records of the Conference.

Any changes in the name and rank of the speaker previously communicated to the secretariat should be provided as early as possible so that the speakers' list can be corrected accordingly. The contact person is <u>Ms. June Budhooram.</u>

Parties are kindly requested to note that the secretariat is not in a position to accommodate individual requests for changes in a Party's speaking slot. Parties wishing to make a change should arrange to exchange slots with another Party, and jointly notify the secretariat of the agreement that has been reached.

Procedures for statements

All Parties are also kindly requested to provide the conference officers with 20 copies of their statements in advance to meet the needs of the interpreters and the Conference records. Parties wishing to have their statements distributed during the plenary meeting are requested to provide 300 copies. These copies may be delivered to the Conference Officers' table outside of Saal Maritim (Plenary I).
