FINANCIACION CON FONDOS EXTRAPRESUPUESTARIOS DE
LA SECRETARIA PROVISIONAL EN 1995

1. La finalidad de esta nota es informar acerca de las necesidades de fondos extrapresupuestarios para el resto de 1995, incluidas las necesidades para las actividades de la secretaría provisional hasta el 31 de diciembre de 1995 y el apoyo a la participación en los períodos de sesiones en los órganos subsidiarios previstos para octubre y principios de noviembre. En la nota se actualizan los cuadros que figuran como anexos al documento A/AC.237/80, preparado para el 11º período de sesiones del Comité Intergubernamental de Negociación de una Convención Marco sobre el Cambio Climático. Los restantes elementos del documento siguen siendo válidos.
2. En el anexo I y en el anexo III se informa, respectivamente, acerca de la situación del fondo fiduciario para el proceso de negociación y del fondo especial de contribuciones voluntarias para apoyo a la participación. Los cambios en las cifras que figuran en el documento A/AC.237/80 reflejan las nuevas promesas hechas y contribuciones recibidas.

3. En el anexo II figuran las estimaciones financieras revisadas para la secretaría provisional, incluido un crédito reducido para personal adicional. Los demás cambios en las cifras que figuran en el documento A/AC.237/80 son metodológicos: la utilización de cifras nominales diferentes para calcular los gastos de personal y un tipo de cambio más realista dólar:franco. Con estos cambios metodológicos las cifras son comparables a las utilizadas en las estimaciones presupuestarias para el bienio 1996-1997 de la Convención (véase FCCC/CP/1995/5/Add.2).

4. Las estimaciones revisadas de financiación con cargo al fondo fiduciario para el proceso de negociación (véase anexo IV) son inferiores en 1,3 millones aproximadamente en la estimación anterior. Sobre la base de los recursos actualmente disponibles, los contratos del personal de la secretaría provisional financiados con cargo a este fondo se han prorrogado hasta el 30 de junio de 1995.

5. Se han facilitado recursos suficientes para que el fondo especial de contribuciones voluntarias pueda financiar la participación de un segundo delegado de países en desarrollo menos adelantados e insulares en el primer período de sesiones de la Conferencia de las Partes. Las estimaciones de financiación con cargo al fondo especial de contribuciones voluntarias para apoyo a la participación (anexo IV) se basan en el supuesto de que los períodos de sesiones de los órganos subsidiarios en octubre/noviembre de 1995 durarían tres semanas. La tercera semana se ha reservado en el calendario de conferencias (y se ha incluido en la presente estimación) como una eventualidad, habida cuenta de la incertidumbre acerca del volumen de trabajo de los órganos subsidiarios, en particular de las necesidades de un posible mecanismo para proceder al examen de los apartados a) y b) del párrafo 2 del artículo 4.

6. En el anexo IV se resumen las necesidades de financiación durante el período restante de 1995 para ambos fondos fiduciarios. Los fondos adicionales requeridos son:

- 2.462.000 dólares para el fondo fiduciario para el proceso de negociación;
- 466.000 dólares para el fondo especial de contribuciones voluntarias para apoyo a la participación.

7. Se invita a la Conferencia de las Partes a que considere y de ser posible suscriba estas estimaciones revisadas y preste su apoyo a los esfuerzos del Secretario Ejecutivo y de los contribuyentes a fin de movilizar las contribuciones voluntarias requeridas.
