NOTIFICATION

This notification is being sent to Parties and Observer States to the Convention. It is addressed to their National Focal Points for Climate Change. For those Parties that have not yet identified National Focal Points, the message is being sent to their Diplomatic Missions accredited to the Federal Republic of Germany; for those Parties not accredited to the Federal Republic of Germany, it is being sent to Permanent Missions in New York or Ministries of Foreign Affairs as appropriate. In all cases, the communication is copied to the Diplomatic Missions accredited to the Federal Republic of Germany and the Permanent Missions to the United Nations Office at Geneva.

On behalf of the Executive Secretary, I wish to notify Parties and Observer States that the sixth session of the Conference of the Parties, including the resumed thirteenth sessions of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) and the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI), will take place at the Netherlands Congress Centre (www.congresscentre.nl), Churchillplein 10, 2508 EA The Hague, Kingdom of the Netherlands, from 13 to 24 November 2000.

It would be appreciated if the names of the heads of delegation and representatives, with their titles and addresses (including fax and e-mail), who will attend the sessions could be communicated to me as soon as possible and not later than Monday, 16 October 2000 at the address of the secretariat:

ANNEX I PROVISIONAL AGENDA

The provisional agenda for the sixth session of the Conference of the Parties, proposed in agreement with the President in accordance with rule 9 of the draft rules of procedure being applied, is as follows:

- 5. Second review of the adequacy of Article 4.2(a) and (b) of the Convention.²
- 6. Proposal to amend the lists in Annexes I and II to the Convention by removing the name of Turkey: review of information and possible decisions under Article 4.2(f) of the Convention.³
- 7. Preparations for the first session of the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol (decision 8/CP.4):
 - (a) National systems, adjustments and guidelines under Articles 5, 7 and 8 of the Kyoto Protocol;
 - (b) Matters relating to land-use, land-use change and forestry;
 - (c) Work programme on mechanisms (decisions 7/CP.4 and 14/CP.5);⁴

At the fifth session of the Conference of the Parties, it "proved impossible to reach any conclusions or decisions" on this matter (FCCC/CP/1999/6, para. 18). The Group of 77 and China proposed amending the item as follows "Review of the adequacy of implementation of Article 4, paragraph 2 (a) and (b), of the Convention" (FCCC/CP/1999/6, para. 17).

The earlier amendment proposed by Kazakhstan to add its name to the list in Annex I was withdrawn by a note verbale dated 13 June 2000.

At the fifth session of the Conference, the President proposed, on the basis of consultations with the Bureau, that with regard to this sub-item it should be understood that the work programme on the Kyoto Protocol mechanisms would be dealt with as a whole. In the same spirit, the Conference of the Parties, at its sixth session, would look at those aspects which are to be acted on by the Conference of the Parties as well as those requiring action by the Conference of the Parties serving as the meeting of the Parties to the Kyoto Protocol at its first session (FCCC/CP/1999/6 para. 16).





ANNEX II PROTOCOL ISSUES

1. Credentials of States Parties to the Convention

In accordance with rule 19 of the draft rules of procedure being applied (FCCC/CP/1996/2), the credentials of representatives of Parties, as well as the names of alternate representatives and advisers, shall be submitted to the secretariat not later than twenty-four hours after the opening of the session. Any later change in the composition of the delegation shall also be submitted to the secretariat.

The credentials must be issued either by the Head of State or Government or by the Minister of Foreign Affairs or, in the case of a regional economic integration organization, by the competent authority of that organization.

States that are not Parties to the Convention are not required to provide their representatives with credentials.

2. <u>High-level segment of the session</u>

The Conference of the Parties will enter its high-level negotiating phase on Monday, 20 November 2000. This phase will continue throughout the week. The President-designate of COP 6, Minister Jan Pronk, hopes for widespread ministerial participation in the consultations and negotiations leading to decisions.

On Tuesday, 21 November 2000, ministers and other heads of delegation of Parties will have the opportunity to address COP 6, under item 9 (a) of the provisional agenda. The recommended time limit for statements is three to four minutes. Statements made on behalf of groups of Parties, where individual members of the group do not speak, would be welcome in order to reduce the overall number of speakers. Such groups will be granted two additional minutes and will be accorded preference in the speaking order. Full texts of the official statements will be circulated, if a sufficient number of copies is provided to the secretariat during the course of the session.

The lists of speakers will be open from Monday, 2 October, to Friday, 3 November 2000. Only requests received during this period will be accepted.
