NOTIFICATION

This notification is being sent to Parties and Observer States to the Convention. It is addressed to their National Focal Points for Climate Change. For those Parties that have not yet identified National Focal Points, the notification is being sent to their diplomatic missions accredited to the Federal Republic of Germany; for those Parties not accredited to the Federal Republic of Germany, it is being sent to permanent missions in New York or Ministries of Foreign Affairs as appropriate. In all cases, the notification is copied to the diplomatic missions accredited to the Federal Republic of Germany and the permanent missions to the United Nations Office at Geneva.

On behalf of the Executive Secretary, I wish to notify Parties and Observer States that the eighth session of the Conference of the Parties, including the seventeenth sessions of the Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice (SBSTA) and the Subsidiary Body for Implementation (SBI), will take place at the Vigyan Bhawan, Maulana Azad Road, New Delhi from Wednesday, 23 October to Friday, 1 November 2002.

ANNEX II

PROTOCOL ISSUES

Credentials of States Parties to the Convention

In accordance with rule 19 of the draft rules of procedure being applied (FCCC/CP/1996/2), the credentials of representatives of Parties, as well as the names of alternate representatives and advisers, shall be submitted to the secretariat not later than twenty-four hours after the opening of the session. Any later change in the composition of the delegation shall also be submitted to the secretariat.

The credentials must be issued either by the head of State or Government or by the Minister of Foreign Affairs or, in the case of a regional economic integration organization, by the competent authority of that organization.

Parties are requested to provide their representatives with full powers to participate in the session, including the authority to adopt decisions, to vote and to serve as officers of the Conference of the Parties and its subsidiary bodies and as officers of any sessional bodies.

States that are not Parties to the Convention are not required to provide their representatives with credentials.

High-level segment of the session

The high-level segment to be attended by ministers and other senior officials will be held from 30 October to 1 November 2002. Ministerial round-table discussions, open to all heads of delegations, will be the vehicle for ministers to exchange views at COP 8.

Further information concerning the high-level segment will be provided nearer to the sessions.
