DESCRIPTION

Like many other developing countries in sub-Saharan Africa, Malawi is grappling with adverse impacts of climate change.

Effective implementation of climate change response initiatives requires high levels of awareness, knowledge and skills on climate change across all socio-economic sectors.

The government of Malawi formulated a Strategy on Climate Change Learning in 2013 to address knowledge gaps that are key for formulating informed policies and climate change interventions. The development of this updated strategy involved multi-stakeholder consultations, complemented with a literature review of key studies that have been conducted in the country since 2013.

The updated strategy is intended to address three key pillars: i) Human capacity building, ii) institutional capacity building and iii) Climate change financing.
