History of the NWP

- 2004 Buenos Aires: Decision 1/CP.10
 - Recognition of the importance of a scientific and technical basis for adaptation and request for SBSTA to develop a five-year programme of work
- 2005 Montréal: Decision 2/CP.11
 - Adoption of SBSTA five-year programme of work on impacts, vulnerability and adaptation to climate change
- 2006 Nairobi: SBSTA conclusions
 - Main outcome of COP 12
 - Agreement on initial activities
 - Review of the NWP at SBSTA 28 (June 2008) based on initial results and findings from IPCC AR4 to identify any new activities
- LIFTET
- Name change to Nairobi Work Programme

Objectives of the NWP

- Assist all Parties, in particular developing countries, including LDCs and **SIDS**
 - to **improve their understanding** and assessment of impacts, vulnerability and adaptation
 - to **make informed decisions** on practical adaptation actions



Expected outcomes of the NWP

- Enhanced capacity for V&A assessment
- Enhanced development, dissemination and use of knowledge from practical adaptation activities
- Improved information and advice to COP and SBs, including facilitation of the implementation of decision 1/CP.10
- Enhanced cooperation among Parties, relevant organizations, business, civil society, and decision makers
- Enhanced integration of actions to adapt to climate change with sustainable development

Links with adaptation under the SBI

- Directly
 - SBSTA mandated to consider relevant outcomes and to provide advice to SBI at SBSTA 28
- Indirectly
 - Scientific and technical basis is necessary "to prevent maladaptation and to ensure that adaptation actions are environmentally sound and will produce real benefits in support of sustainable development" (1/CP.10).
 - Assessment and evaluation process of 1/CP.10 will be enhanced by activities under the NWP and at the same time provide input into activities under the NWP, including in:
 - methods and tools, data and observation, climate modeling, scenarios and downscaling, climate related risks and extreme events, and adaptation planning and practices



Focus until SBSTA 26

- Under Climate related risks and extreme events
 - Submissions by Parties and relevant organizations by 23 February 2007 containing information on their relevant programmes, activities and views
 - Workshop from 11-13 June, Alexandria, Egypt (*tbc*)
- Under Adaptation planning and practices and Technologies
 - Submissions by Parties and relevant organizations by 15 May 2007 containing information on adaptation approaches, strategies, practices and technologies for adaptation
 - Structure for submissions on unfccc.int
 - Workshop in September (*tbc*)
