The theme for this year's event is 'Harnessing natural resources and ecosystems for adaptation'.

CBA11 aims to share and consolidate the latest developments in community-based adaptation practices, policy and theory across sectors globally. It aims to strengthen the existing network of practitioners, policymakers, planners and donors working on all levels of community-based adaptation, and enhance the capacity of practitioners, governments and donors to help improve the livelihoods of those most vulnerable to climate change.

The 2017 conference will be hosted by the Government of Uganda. It is being organised by IIED, the <u>International Centre on Climate Change and Development (ICCCAD)</u>, the <u>Makerere University Centre for Climate Change Research and Innovations (MAK)</u> and the <u>Ugandan Ministry of Water and Environment</u>.

The NAP Expo is an outreach event organized by the Least Developed Countries Expert Group (LEG) under the UN-FCCC, in collaboration with various bodies and organizations, to promote exchange of experiences and foster partnerships between a wide range of actors and stakeholders on how to advance National Adaptation Plans (NAPs). It brings together a diversity of Party and non-Party stakeholders to exchange ideas and deliberate on ways to further advance NAPs.

In addition to events organized at the global level, the LEG discussed the value of holding NAP expos at the regional level, in collaboration with relevant regional events and activities such as the training workshops on NAPs, as a way to promote greater interaction among countries. The regional NAP expos will also provide an opportunity to enhance collaboration with various partners at the regional levels.

The organizers of the 11th Community Based Adaptation (CBA 11) Conference have extended an invitation to the LEG to consider convening a regional NAP Expo in conjunction with the Conference taking place in Kampala, Uganda from 23 to 29 June 2017. The first Regional NAP Expo will be held on 28 June 2017, in Kampala, Uganda. It consists of one morning of plenary session focused on the process to formulate and implement NAPs, and one afternoon of parallel sessions related to vulnerable communities and ecosystems.

The overall objective of the NAP Expo is to advance the formulation and implementation of NAPs. Specific objectives are as follows:

- a. To provide a platform for focused interactions between Parties and non-Party Stakeholders on aspects that advance the formulation and implementation of NAPs;
- b. To serve as a forum for sharing experience, best practices, lessons learned, gaps and needs and information on support provided and received in relation to the process to formulate and implement NAPs;
- c. To offer a platform for countries to interact with providers of support, including the GCF and GEF, and bilateral agencies as means to improve access to financing for NAPs;
- d. To serve as a global forum on NAPs where different organizations and bodies can conduct specialized meetings and workshops with a view to ensuring coherence among the approaches undertaken in supporting countries undertake the process.



- b. To offer a platform to showcase samples of processes and outputs of adaptation planning and implementation from other countries, to offer lessons to those developing adaptation plans in developing country settings.
- c. To promote good practice in adaptation planning by sharing success stories and negative experiences from the experience of others, recognizing that adaptation will improve over time through learning-by-doing.
- d. To provide a main entry to NAP practitioners and offer links to available resources (funding and technical support), programmes supporting adaptation in developing countries, state of the science on aspects of adaptation (data, assessment, responses, etc), and provide a platform for sharing experience and ideas for advancing adaptation planning.


